Incident Summary

On 1-19-13, at approx 0910 hrs, Ofc L Baker and Ofc Callaghan responded to the area o welfare check. This was a return call from the mother of the subject. She advised her son, Robert Pomares, had been in phone contact with her and a friend and that he was suicidal. He was apparently upset over the recent death of his brother on Christmas day and he was also mentally retarded per his mom 43rd St is the home of the parents of a childhood friend. Both officers checked the surrounding area and could not find him. A short time later Ofc N Duckham put herself on this call as she had been on the previous call (13-16272) to Folsom BI and 53rd St for the same subject and she did not locate him at that time.

At approx 0946 hrs Ofc Duckham drove past the house on 43rd St one last time and spotted a male subject north of the residence. She tried to talk to him but he fled south on 43rd St and went to the front door of 43rd St. She advised via radio that she had the subject at the front door. Officer Callaghan was there within a minute and the two contacted him at the door. They had to keep a safe distance as he was brandishing a knife and stabbing himself. Ofc Duckham deployed her CED as Ofc Callaghan had lethal coverage. The CED did not stop the subject so Ofc Duckham used Ofc Callaghan's CED as well. This too struck the subject however he did not stop his actions.

Subject Pomares went south on the front porch and down the side yard where there is a large wooden gate. The subject broke out a side window and officers were afraid he was going to try and crawl into the residence. By this point Ofc Baker had made it to the scene. Ofc Duckham is a member of SPD's HNT team and was trying to calm Pomares during this event. He would not listen and he continued to stab himself. Ofc Baker used her own CED. In all she used all three of her cartridges cycling numerous times. Officers T Butler, J Warren, E Zeek, M Frazer, Sgt Bell and Ofc Bohrer each arrived and all deployed their own CEDs in the hope to stop Pomares from stabbing himself. This was not working so Ofc M Frazer retrieved the bean bag gun in Sgt Bell's vehicle. He received bean bag rounds from Ofc Baker. Ofc Frazer fired off four bean bag rounds at the subject. A combination perhaps of the bean bag rounds with the victim using his own knife to stab himself finally stopped him from assaulting himself any more where the officers felt safe enough to approach. The knife was kicked away and Ofc Frazer and Ofc Duckham began first aid on the subject as Sac Fire personnel entered the scene.

The subject was taken by ambulance to UCD Med Center where he was pronounced deceased at 1033 hrs.

I reviewed the ICC video and audio that had captured the audio portion of this incident. The ICC cameras were running in the following officers vehicles: Pangelinan, Bohrer, Matthews, Baker, Butler and Sgt Bell. No other officers that were on scene upon my arrival had either their cameras on at all or they arrived after the fact and were not of the actual incident.

In reviewing the taser download I can verify whose tasers were used and how many cycles each taser had at the time of the incident. I am not able to determine how many actual cartridges were used by which officer nor which officers probes had actually struck the individual and lastly which were effective. In addition once Ofc Duckham's initial deployment of her CED proved to be ineffective she took Ofc Callaghan's and discharged it at the subject. The Blue Team system would not allow me to add an additional entry for this type of force under her name. The serial # for this taser is X00-515904. It appears she fired one cartridge with presumably two darts coming from it for one cycle.

In talking with Sgt Stigerts I learned there were eight probe marks on the subject. Some in pairs and others that were solo. As far as which were effective is based on the individual officer's statements to detectives of which I have not been able to access thus at this time they are deemed ineffective .

In regards to Ofc Frazer deploying the bean bag gun it appears that three of the four rounds struck the

individual (lower right chest, back right thigh, and left calf). The effectiveness is speculation based on it occurring just as the subject stopped injuring himself.

Bell and ask her to have a discussion with the involved officers regarding possible alternatives to repeated use of the CED in situations like this. One of my suggestions would the deployment of the 40mm less lethal weapon. If that equipment wasn't available or personnel need the training that needs to happen. Thinking outside the box, I would also suggest considering calling in Fire from their staging point to direct a large amount of water at the subject from a fire hose while providing the firefighters lethal cover and the safety of distance.



Upon arrival, several officers were giving commands to a male subject (Robert Pomares) who was holding a knife up to his body and bleeding. Pomares was sitting on the ground on the southeast corner of 43rd St. I maintained a perimeter position out on the sidewalk approximately 40 ft away keeping citizens away from danger.

Once the subject was detained, I closed off the south and east sides of the scene with crime scene tape.

I contacted W- and took her statement (see statement).

I responded to UCD Medical Center and contacted Dr. who stated that Pomares was pronounced dead at 1033 hours. Dr. was advised of the circumstances surrounding Pomares's injuries. Dr. stated that Pomares appeared blue in color when Medics brought him into the ER.

Medical personnel had removed all of Pomares's clothing and placed it into a bag. I took custody of the bag for evidence. Medical personnel had removed taser wires, cartridge, and probes and placed them in a hazardous waste bin prior to my arrival. I collected the taser wires, cartridge, and probes as evidence and secured them in a plastic bag.

Medical staff advised that the injury most likely responsible for cause of death was the large laceration to the neck of Pomares. The laceration was approximately 3 inches long and had a Trachea tube inserted into Pomares. I observed a large opening on the left torso of Pomares. Staff advised that they had make an opening into Pomares to "massage his heart" in an attempt to revive him. I observed another laceration about 2 inches long on the left bicep of Pomares. I also observed a large bruise about 2 inches in diameter under the right thigh. Pomares had dried blood all over his body making it difficult to determine if there were any other injuries.

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

While enroute to the call officers who were already on scene advised they needed additional tasers. I responded Code to the location and arrived at 0954 hours.

Once onscene, I saw the officers at 43rd St., standing on the side of the house. I saw a white male subject holding a large butcher knife in his right hand. The subject had taser wires attached to his clothing. It appeared that Ofc. Duckham #830 (1B35) was talking to the male subject trying to calm him down. There were approximately 5 officers standing behind Ofc. Duckham that were covering with lethal force and some that were covering with tasers. The subject was sitting down on the ground with his legs out in front of him. He appeared distraught but was focusing on Ofc. Duckham. I took a position of cover behind a vehicle that was parked in the driveway.

I offered my taser to Ofc. Baker #756 (1B35) who was closer to the subject but she advised the tasers were ineffective on the subject. The subject was still holding the knife and would not drop it per officers commands. Officers were yelling for the subject numerous times to drop the knife however the male subject would not drop the knife.

While onscene I observed the subject put the knife to the middle of his chest and it appeared he was pushing it into his body. Officers continued to yell for him to drop the knife. The subject then moved the knife to his throat area. He appeared to be holding it at the area of his Adam's Apple. Officers again, yelled "NO" to him and told him to drop the knife. The subject ignored officers commands and began pushing the knife into his throat. The subject removed the knife from his neck area but refused to drop it out of his hand. An officer retreived a bean-bag shotgun and began shooting the bean-bag rounds at the subject as a distractionary device to get him to drop the knife. The officer shot approximately 5 bean bag rounds at the subject but it was ineffective at getting him to drop the knife. I could still see the knife in the subject's hand.

The subject had fallen from a sitting position to laying on his back. The



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subject appeared to go unconscious and his hand released the knife. Officers kicked the knife out of the way and immediately began CPR on the subject.



Robert never calls me but he started calling me around 7am this morning. I was still sleeping and did not answer. He left a message for me to call him. When I woke up I called him at 8 am. Robert was talking crazy which I expected since he is Schizophrenic. He was saying people were after him and trying to kill him. I told him to calm down and that no one was trying to get him. He then asked if I could come pick him up. I told him I was in San Jose because I did not want to be around him while he was acting like this.

At 8:37 called asking if I could try to get a hold of Robert and find out where he was because she was calling the police. She stated Robert was having an episode. She did not know I had already talked to him. I told her I had just talked to him and he told me he was at Burger King on Folsom Blvd. She said she was going to call the police and tell them.

Robert called me again about 15 minutes later. I asked him where he was. He told me he was by St. Francis H.S. on M St. He said President Bush's people were after him and were going to hang him. He also said they had his dad and they were torturing his dad.

A side note, about 10 years ago Robert went to his grandparents old house and broke into the house. He was fully armed when he did this. He spent several years in a mental hospital in Napa. He has not always had these mental issues. He began to develop them about 15 years ago. He has had seizures and has a metal plate in his head. I think the metal plate is from a rugby accident in high school.

I told Robert to stay calm and stay where he was. After I got off the phone with Robert a police officer called. It was 9:26 am. This call was 15-20 minutes after I got off the phone with Robert. The officer (male) said that he had heard I had been in contact with Robert and they were trying to locate where he was. I told him Robert was

answering my calls. I told the officer that I would call Robert back and find out where he was. The officer said he would call back in a few minutes. I called Robert on his cell phone **sector** immediately after talking to the officer.

I asked Robert where he was and Robert said he was at 46th (Street) and J (St). I asked Robert which way he was walking and he said he was heading toward my parents house (43rd St). I told him to just stay there and someone was on their way to help him. The officer called back a few minutes later. I told the officer Robert's current location, that he was walking toward 43rd St., and my parents address. The officer said he would head that direction and check my parent's house.

At 9:37, I called my parents and told them what was going on. I told them if Robert showed up not to answer the door and call 911. At 9:49 my mom called and was crying. She said they were locked in their bedroom because Robert was there. She said the police were already there with him. She said Robert had broken out their window. I got off the phone with her and immediately drove to their house.

When I got there Robert was on the driveway up against the gate. He was sitting with his back against the gate. He was surrounded by officers. There were at least 15 officers there. I could see that he was holding a knife up to his throat. I could see this from the end of my parent's driveway, maybe a little more than 30 feet. The officers were Tazering him. I heard about eight Tazer's go off. The only thing I could hear the officers yell was "Don't do it." I do not know if it was before or after they shot him with bean bags.

I heard 3-4 bean bag shots. There was an officer standing by me telling me that they were not shooting him, they were bean bags and non lethal. After the bean bag shots, Robert was surrounded by officers and I could see them start chest compressions on him. I did not see him cutting himself because there were so many officers surrounding him and the officer near me kept telling me to step back. Thank god I did not see that. My daughter was standing next to me. Her name is **Determine**. She is 14 years old.

I saw the ambulance show up and wheel him out. The officers were doing chest compressions the entire time until the Fire Department showed up. When the Fire Department was wheeling him out they were still doing chest compressions on him.

I do not know if Robert does any illegal drugs. I know he has been prescribed several medications but according to his mom, he does not take them on a regular basis. I know you will talk to his mom and that will be really important. His mom and cousin have been with him the last three days and they said he has been out of his mind crazy. His cousin's name is

His mom mentioned that Robert was with **sectors** last night and he was completely psychotic. They drove him to a hospital this morning to try to have him admitted. I do not know what hospital it was. When they got there he ran away. Robert's mom told me this this morning when she first called me.

Robert was my best friend while growing up. We stayed in contact through the years. I am also very close to was very close to Robert's brother especially over the past three years. (Robert's brother) passed away 3-4 weeks ago from an illness associated to alcoholism. It has been really hard on and Robert. They were not able to have a proper burial for because they did not have the money to take care of it.

I think it was a combination of losing his brother and him reaching out to his father to help with the burial. His father basically said "Screw him". I think this threw him over the edge.

I last spoke to Robert just after Christmas about money for **burial** burial. Robert wanted me to come by and see him. I did not get a chance to do that and I feel really guilty. I have thought this may happen because this type of craziness has happened in the past. Robert spent three years in a mental hospital because of a crime he committed. This was in 2003 or 2004. It was 8-10 years ago. He has a history of mental instability. He wasn't like that when he was little. The Crystal Meth really messed him up. It induced the psychosis that really brought this out. He first started with Ecstasy then started doing Cocaine and moved to the Crystal Meth.

The incident that occurred about 8-10 years ago involved Robert breaking into his grandparents place with a dog and guns. He thought Gypsies were taking over his grandparent's house. I don't ever think the grandparents were even alive. I know they did not live there when he went there. The courts sent him to Napa instead of prison. He spent three years there.

Robert started using Ecstasy in late 90's. From 2000-2002 he started using powder cocaine. He started using Crystal Meth right around 2002 and I don't know if he ever stopped. He told me he was able to get drugs in the mental hospital. As soon as he got out of the hospital he moved to the Chico area. I do not know how he is connected to the Chico area.

Over the past couple years he has been staying in West Sacramento. He kept wanting me to come visit him but he was complaining about having these seizures and hearing voices. I was hesitant to bring him back into my life because I have a three year old son now.



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He was on medication for his seizures and mental issues. I don't think he was using the Meth since he was on the medication. The Crystal is what really sent him over the top. One he started using that he got messed up. He was a normal kid and got good grades.

His mother was a little coo coo. Everyone in East Sac knew about her issues. She had a little crazy in her.

Robert grew up on the corner of 46th St and Folsom Blvd right down the street from me. He lived with his brother and two half brothers and and the (Father) and the (Step Mother) were the parents. In ever liked to or Robert. She always favored her two sons and the She wore the pants at the house.

Around 2003 he left this crazy voicemail on my phone. He was talking about going and getting "them". He was talking about Gypsies'. He had this thing about Gypsies. When I heard the message I was wondering what he was going to do and that is when he did the thing at his grandparent's old house. My dates may be just a hair off.

Once he got out of Napa he started complaining about the seizures. Around 10-12 years old Robert had some sort of accident where he had to have the metal plate put in his head. I do not remember what the accident was. After the metal plate he still seemed normal.

After died, went up to Chico and picked Robert up. He stayed at house and they grieved together. He was upset that his father would not contribute to determined burial. He seemed pretty normal. I had to call and tell Robert that did not make it through the surgery. He had multiple surgeries due to issues with his stomach and esophagus related to drinking too much. I did not know determined was that big a drinker. I think really started drinking around 2000.

I do not know of any specific incident that really set these brothers down the path of destruction. I think it was just wear and tear on them from growing up in a family that did not care about them that led them to alcohol and drugs.



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They had a celebration for **sector** life Sunday before last. I sent Robert a text. I did not like the meeting place for the event. They met at the Zebra Club. I thought that was stupid and ironic so I did not go. I asked Robert for an address to send some money to chip in for the funeral. I did not get a response.

This morning called my brother and told him what was going on. That is how I heard about this. He is in the other room (interview room).

and was had been seeing each other for the past 3 years. Was like a father figure to was like a father figure to was like a father figure to was a big influence in both their lives. Was not really close to Robert, more to was a close. There was a stretch where they weren't but recently they were.

When Robert was using Crystal he was always paranoid that people were out to get him. About six to twelve months ago Robert told me he was hearing voices that were telling him to harm people he loved. That freaked me out. At that point I did not think we could hang out any more. That scared me. We did not have any contact for several months after that.

On 1/19/13, at approximately 1454 hours, I met **Exercise** in the kitchen of her home at I took her recorded statement. She told me the following in summary:

My son Robert grew up fine. He was a good kid.

As a sophomore he was playing rugby. He got hit in the head and ended up in the hospital and had a plate that was about 4" by 3" put in the top of his head and he was really never the same since. He was on total disability. He went kind of back and forth between Chico and West Sacramento. He'd go up to Chico because he liked it up there but then my son and I were down here and he'd want to see us so he'd move back here. That was the way it was.

My other son **barrow**, a little over 4 and one half years ago, his stomach completely erupted and we didn't think he was going to make it through the night. He did, miraculously and for the next 4 and a half years he went through 14 surgeries to replace an aortic valve problem and finally, he went from 145 to 85 (pounds) and finally everything just gave out so he was buried. He passed away Christmas morning. We went up to Chico and got Rob and came down and said our goodbyes.

He passed here. I had called the medics and they were right here and they sort of had him partially coming back but his brain function wouldn't work again so 4:44 Christmas Day he died. He was 41.

Robert came back here to go to the funeral and kind of to assist but as time went on he got more agitated and about 3 nights ago he said he couldn't sleep in his room. He had to sleep in my room with me and I was so tired. I said okay. He kept me up the whole night. He saw visions. He said people were coming through the doors. They were going to take him and hang him and there were people out in front and he went out, 3 o'clock in the morning, ran into the street with a stick and though it was a knife and it was really bad.

I think I got 2 hours sleep. So my cousin, their cousin, said why don't you come spend the day with me, give your mom a break. That was a good idea. That's

He ended up spending the night and then the next day and the next night he pulled the same thing on **and** and she never got any sleep at all and it was the same thing. He was hallucinating and what he really wanted to do was he wanted to be dead and go up to heaven and be with **and** and he did the first half of it anyway.

He went down to **be a set of** is a good friend and kind of part time lover for my son **be a set of**. Her parents live at 42nd Street. Rob eventually was wandering around by himself for about 3 hours. He went to their house. He started breaking all of the doors and windows. This is today. I never left the house. I've been in constant contact



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with **several** others. Somehow he got a big knife and they were trying to get the knife away from him and get him confined and he slit his throat. They took him away. They apparently took him to the Med Center and they tried but he was dead.

Rob had a little house. It was a really little house. There were only 2 or 3 rooms and it was behind what they called the big house, the regular house. He didn't do anything. He got about \$800 in disability and then **1000**, Rob, and **1000** all got \$500 a month from their grandmother as a trust and instead of giving them lump sums they would get a check every month for \$500. That way **1000** thought they would all keep in contact with each other. **1000** is the only one left, my nephew. **1000** is in prison. He is **1000** for **1000**.

I don't know the address Rob stayed.

Rob has done things like this frequently but not to the extent of all night and just ranting and raving and so forth. He had which is very potent. Usually he takes it between 7 and 8 o'clock at night and that will usually put him out until about 11 o'clock the next morning. He's been not taking it the last 3 days. He just didn't take it. In fact he'd even taken it over to house and didn't take it there. It's still over there.

Robert's father knows what happened. In 1978, we were down in Monterey at a convention and my head burst and I wasn't supposed to survive. I wasn't supposed to be 5 minutes but I made it. It took 5 years but I finally got back into teaching.

I think Rob called me or maybe I called him this morning. Rob said, "I want to come home. I want to come home." And I said great, I'll even give you money for a cab but I am going to find some help for you because you've got some real problems and he said, "No!" and that's the last I ever heard. That was maybe 8 o'clock this morning. I called him a couple of times with no answer. That was this morning. Yesterday he called here about 7 or 8 times and sometimes he wouldn't even talk but it was like he needed to hear my voice and finally the last 2 times he didn't even talk and I said in this case I'm not going to answer the phone anymore, goodnight.

Rob didn't say he was suicidal to me yesterday during the day. I know that he told **twice** and he told I think it was **twice** once. She was supposed to be on her way to San Jose for 3 days for a volleyball tournament and that all kind of blew up.

Robert spent 4 years at Napa State Hospital but that was 25 to 30 years ago (friends try to clarify). He was 20. (Friends clarify it was around 2000 to 2002 after he went to Lake County Jail and it was after second aneurysm).

Stories like the kids leaving their shoes out so she would throw them in the pool during the middle of winter and make the boys swim to get them out. Stuff like that.

We did not see them for a long time. We only went over to their a couple times. We would see them from time to time at the tennis club but did not interact with them for decades. It became apparent that there were issues between the parents and the kids at some point. I do not know what the kids were doing but the parents were getting very disenchanted with what the children were doing. This went to the point that the parents (and kicked the kids out of the house and they had to stay with friends in the neighborhood. This occurred and

People in the neighborhood were very upset with and because they did this to the two Pomares boys. I do not know what the issues were between the parents and the children but people have told me it was alcohol for and drugs for Robert.



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Robert's psychotic episodes began about a decade ago. I heard about an issue that occurred at his former grandmother's house. There was something about Robert thinking people were doing something to his grandmother at a house. So he rushed in to save her but she no longer lived there. The SWAT Team had to come and deal with it. I do not know where this occurred. The next thing was that he was hospitalized in Napa.

I was talking with them earlier today (after this incident). They initially called me and I was updating them on what was going on. They could not find out any information on his status. We probably had not seen him for 20 years. My suspicion is that is what drew him to our house today. He had a link to his past and we were nice to him.

He told us about how Chico had fewer "Demons" than here at the funeral. The funeral was the first week of January. I do not know the exact date. He did not seem stable at the funeral. He was talking like a child in a baby voice at the funeral. It was very odd.

His issues were with him thinking "bad guys" were chasing him.

A short time later I looked out the window and saw Robert walking away from the front door toward my car. About this time my wife had asked me if I had seen any patrol cars drive by because had also called 911 and given them the information about Robert. Just as I saw Robert walking away from the house I saw a patrol car driving by. The patrol car must have flipped around because I saw the female officer walking up toward Robert. I heard her say, "Robert, we need to talk to you." She started talking to him very calmly.

Most of the talking throughout the entire incident was being done by the female officer. Robert became immediately agitated and saying "I know who you are and what you are trying to do to me". He did not want any part of cooperating. She was very calm and trying to keep things low key.

Robert ended up by the driveway. The next thing I know is there was this sound that sounded like an explosion. He must have slammed into our gate and at the same time smashed out the window to our kitchen. I do not know if he was trying to break in or get away.

I heard that and locked the door. I went upstairs and was able to look out the window down at the driveway where everything was going on. I could not see the female officer but could hear her talking to Robert. I was in the bedroom above the driveway. The female officer was saying, "Robert, I do not want to hurt you and my partner does not want to hurt you. Put the knife down." She said that at least 6-8 times.

Robert was totally resistant to everything they were saying. I could hear people saying "I'm going to Tazer him." I could hear the pops like cap guns. I heard many pops from the Tazers. It was probably 6-8 pops from the Tazer. I thought it was a distraction device at the time. The word Tazer was being said. You could tell when he was being hit by it because he would scream and resist it. He is a very strong guy, he is like a bull.



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I heard three louder sounds. I actually thought they were shooting him. The police later told me they were bean bags. I saw shells sitting on my driveway.

While everything was going on I couldn't resist going back to the front door. I could clearly see Robert laying on the ground. They had rolled him on the ground right by the fence with his feet facing the street. There were four officers surrounding him. You could clearly say he was subdued. I called my wife and let her know that the situation was secured and we should get out of the house. She came down and we went out of the house.

While he was on the ground, he was clearly moving and resisting the officers. They were not on top of him but they were putting pressure on him holding him down. He was laying on his back.

The Tazers and the shotgun seemed to be a progression of activity. There was not the Tazers and then peace and quiet and then someone shot the shotgun. It was a definite progression. I cannot remember anything in particular as to what the officers were saying.

I never saw a knife until I saw it in my back yard. The officers told me they kicked it in my back yard to get it away from him. I was thinking how glad I was he did not get into the house with that thing.

I was struck with how hard they were trying to calm him down. My wife was even more struck with that part. It was to the point that we wanted to thank the officers. They were really trying hard to get him to stop. He was obviously not having any part of it.

It really is not a tragedy because Robert's life was horrible. This is a relief for him. I am thankful that he did it himself rather than a police man have to do it for him. I do not think there is anything that the officers could have done to change the outcome. There was not a word out of his mouth that was not militantly resistant.

After my wife and I walked out of the house we went across the street. I did not see anything they were doing. I did not see anyone doing CPR but others said they saw them doing CPR. I did not see the firemen doing CPR when Robert was on the Gurney either.

I was amazed at how quickly the police came and how quickly the firemen showed up.

(1-19-13, 1537 hours, Hall of Justice, interview room #6, SPOA Attorney Judith Odbert present, audio/video recorded, in summary:)

I've been a sworn officer with the department since April, 1995. I'm currently assigned to patrol, day shift, in sector 3.

Officer Callaghan and I were dispatched to the initial welfare check [of POMARES] near St. Francis High School. He was supposed to be on-foot and was here from Chico. I think his mother stated in the original call that she didn't want POMARES at her home, that he was suicidal and that he might have been retarded to the age of 10, or something like that.

Ofc. Callaghan and I met near St. Francis, and we were updated that POMARES had called his mother. His mother was aged, and was confused when talking to POMARES. We called a friend of POMARES' who I think was named "**Constant**." Ofc. Callaghan was talking to her to get more information. Ofc. Duckham was on her way to the area because it was her beat.

The last update we received from "**W** was that POMARES was somewhere on J Street near 43rd Street. Officer Duckham was close to that area, so she headed to that location while Officer Callaghan and I went to J Street.

I got to J Street and Officer Callaghan took a different route, so he was somewhere else. I heard Officer Duckham say on the radio that she believed she found POMARES on 43rd Street, and that he was armed with a knife. I think Officer Callaghan arrived there next. I remember he notified the residents there to stay indoors because POMARES was armed with the knife.

As I came down 43rd Street southbound from J Street, I stopped to block any traffic from approaching the scene. I heard Officer Callaghan say on the radio that he needed code-3 assistance. I was up the street, so I went to the scene. When I got there, I heard a "squeal." It was kind of like a "girlish squeal." It didn't say anything, it was like a "squeal." I saw POMARES on the front porch of the house. I remember that POMARES and the officers were moving in a south direction off the porch. I stopped in the middle of the street and parked adjacent to a car parked at the curb.

I didn't see how the officers moved, but I want to say I first saw Officer Callaghan and Officer Duckham when they were on the south side of the front porch, south of POMARES. When POMARES moved off the porch, he walked between the officers, the house, and the car that was parked in the driveway. POMARES walked between the house and the car, and he had to get over a rose bush or something that was at the front of the car to get to the west end of the driveway.



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I remember seeing POMARES punch a window on the south side of the house. I didn't see him make an overt attempt to climb through the window because the hole he made didn't look like he could. He'd have to hit it again to make the hole large enough to get in.

I want to say POMARES was dressed in a thick flannel-something on the top, and maybe some jeans. That's all I remember.

Things didn't look calm. Officer Callaghan moved to the south side of the driveway. I remember that Ofc. Duckham had a taser in her hand, and so I deployed a taser. POMARES sat down on the ground and leaned against a fence at the west end of the driveway. I don't remember POMARES saying anything. I went to the white carport posts on the south side of the driveway. Officer Callaghan was positioned near me by one of the other white posts. Officer Duckham was to my right [north] in front of the car in the driveway.

I noticed immediately that POMARES was injured. "Oh my God, his neck was sliced open. It was obvious. It was deep." It wasn't until after I saw POMARES punching the window that I saw his neck. I don't know when his injury happened. He seemed to have difficulty speaking because of the injury. I don't think he could breathe right, but he tried.

Officer Duckham tried to talk to POMARES, so she put her taser away to keep him calm. POMARES didn't react. He took the knife and he was going to stab himself in the stomach, and I tased him. It didn't do anything. I was the first officer to use the taser on POMARES. I was 10-11 feet from POMARES when I discharged the taser [darts]. I didn't see if the darts struck his body because I was focused on the knife in his hand. I know the taser discharged. I could hear it cycling. I don't remember how many times I cycled during the first discharge.

Officer Duckham is "HNT" [Hostage Negotiation Team] and I knew that. Officer Callaghan and Officer Duckham were kind of talking at the same time, so I told Officer Callaghan to "let her have it, let her do it" because she's HNT and she was establishing a rapport because it was working at times. I heard Officer Duckham telling POMARES that she didn't feel safe, and we didn't feel safe and that we were worried about his safety. I think she even asked him if he trusted her, and that's when she put her taser away to show him. I don't know why he wouldn't let go of the knife. Officer Duckham would try to talk about his family and get him to focus on her to work on calming him.

During this time, POMARES was constantly holding the knife to his neck or to his abdomen. He would thrash it about in front of us because he didn't want us to get closer. Nobody made any attempt to do that, but he was afraid we would. It just kept going on like that. He reacted immediately to the slightest things. After I ran out of taser cartridges, I think I pulled my gun out, and POMARES reacted to that, so I put it back. I still had lethal cover. Officer Duckham could deploy her taser, and I could still use my taser if POMARES didn't have the knife. I expected that at one point POMARES might get up and charge us, so I didn't want to be armed with just the taser.

Officer Callaghan let Officer Duckham talk to POMARES, and I went to retrieve another taser cartridge from my car because nobody had any cartridges left. I don't know what the other officers did before I arrived, but they told me they were out of cartridges, so that's why I went back to my car to get more.

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I came back and POMARES still had the knife. He wouldn't put it down and he wasn't complying with the commands to drop the knife. Officer Duckham was trying very hard to disarm him, but he wouldn't do it. Again, POMARES threatened himself with the knife. I think he took to his neck again, and I tased him again. It looked like he may have been affected for a brief second. But then, there was nothing. He just kept going. He was agitated, but in a seated position.

At one point, POMARES tried to lean forward. He never got up, but I sensed that he was going to roll onto his knees because he was very agitated, and now he saw that other people were coming. POMARES became very threatened by that, so I tried to back people [responding officers] off so that they wouldn't force anything from happening, and so we wouldn't lose control.

We kept some officers back, so it was just us [Officer Duckham, Officer Callaghan, Officer Baker]. I called Sgt. Bell via radio to stage the bean bag gun, because I thought our tasers weren't working. We didn't want POMARES to deteriorate to the point where he was actually successful in harming himself. Sgt. Bell was coming, but she was at Alhambra Boulevard, so she was still coming from a distance.

And then Officer T. Butler arrived, and I asked him for a taser cartridge because we needed taser cartridges. Officer Butler gave me a cartridge, and POMARES started making overt stabbing motions to himself and he was bleeding horribly. I tased him again, and it was ineffective. It seemed like the taser would make him stop for a second. He would get stiff and close his eyes, but then he opened them again and would start moving while I was still cycling the taser. I don't know if the taser was malfunctioning. I don't know if he was stiffening up because of me. POMARES never corrected himself to where he would be calm during those periods when we were worried about him. He would continuously stab himself.

I don't remember how many times I cycled the taser. I think I cycled it continuously. At that point it was me, Officer Callaghan, Officer Butler and Officer Duckham who were facing POMARES. I don't remember who else was behind me, but I know the bike officers came, but then Sgt. Bell arrived. I think I heard her saying she didn't have her bean bag rounds or something. I told her I had bean bag rounds left over from being an acting Sergeant two years ago, so I ran to my car and got the bean bag rounds.

Officer Frazer went to Sgt. Bell's car to get the bean-bag shotgun. I gave the bean bag rounds to Officer Frazer, and he loaded the bean bag shotgun with them, and we went back into the scene. Officer Frazer immediately fired four bean bag rounds at POMARES with no success. It appeared that it had no effect on POMARES whatsoever. It was frightening, it was so surreal, especially after all those taser cartridges.

POMARES still had the knife in his hand. He was still lucid. He was still aware. I don't know if he was trying to say anything anymore. At one point, he leaned into a shrub on the south side of his position. I couldn't see what POMARES was doing. I couldn't see what he was doing with the knife. Everyone started to sense about what might come out of the shrub with him.

Eventually, POMARES came back into view. I don't think he ever got to a standing position. He was always in a seated position with his back against the fence. We officers were facing him telling him to drop the knife, but



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POMARES kept wielding it. The knife was covered in blood. You could see POMARES was "winding down." It got to the point that, I want to say that he just "lost everything." He passed out maybe. I'm not sure. He was slowing down, and then he just "plopped" straight down. He laid down. Officer Duckham never stopped talking to POMARES that I can remember.

It wasn't until that time that I think it was Officer Zeek who pulled POMARES by the feet away from his position away from the knife, which was good. This was the first possibility that we could have separated POMARES from the knife. When POMARES laid down, I think the knife went to his right side. Officer Zeek pulled him out, and the other officers went to restrain POMARES' arms. I think Officer Frazer was in the head positon, Officer Duckham, I think, was at his right hand, and I can't remember who had the other hand. I crossed POMARES' feet so he couldn't kick or try to work his way out.

Somebody said something about, "Is he breathing?" Someone was trying to take his pulse, and they didn't believe he had a pulse, so Officer Duckham started CPR. She continued CPR to the point that she asked if POMARES had a pulse again, and they said "No." She kept going with CPR until the fire department came, and they said it was going to be a "pick up and go." We knew we were stable at that point.

Duckham was Sean Howell (Attorney at Law). This interview was audio/video recorded and I later booked the DVD into evidence. The following is a transcribed summary of the interview:

SM: Ofc. Duckham right?

ND: Yes.

SM: Can you spell your last name for me?

- ND: D-U-C-K-H-A-M.
- SM: Natalie, what is your badge number?

ND: 830.

SM: You were working today as a dayshift unit?

ND: Yes.

- SM: What unit were you?
- ND: Bravo 38.
- SM: Dayshift is what?
- ND: 6 AM to 4 PM.
- SM: Bravo 38, is that like district 38 or how does that work?

ND: District 3C.

SM: What area is that.



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ND: The west side is Alhambra. The south side is (highway 50) and it goes all the way out to Howe Ave. on the east side. The north side is all the way up to the railroad tracks.

SM: So mid-town, from Alhambra out.

ND: Yes.

- SM: 30's, 40's and out to Howe Ave. How long have you been an officer with us?
- ND: Since 2004.
- SM: So nine years. Have you spent most of your time in patrol?

ND: Yes.

- SM: Any other specialty assignments?

- ND: A hostage negotiator.
- SM: How long have you been with the HNT team of the police department?

ND: Responds to incidents where people either want to commit suicide or are barricaded or a hostage situation. We are called out to respond to talk to the individual.

SM: Being a part of the HNT team is an auxiliary duty on top of what you have to do on patrol?

ND: Correct.

SM: I imagine as a patrol officer that you get to use those skills since you are already out there that they utilize you quite a bit.

ND: Correct.



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SM: As far as HNT, do you have any specialized training that you have had to do for that?

ND: We went through a week long academy held by the FBI here in Sacramento and then we have quarterly training which is once every three months and then we have monthly training and we have yearly training.

SM: In this monthly, quarterly, and yearly training, what type of stuff do you guys go over?

ND: We debrief situations that we have been in the past. How we dealt with it and what we did wrong and right. Scenarios, going over equipment, stuff like that.

SM: When you train do you ever talk about within those scenarios specific to a suicidal subject or a barricaded subject or somebody that has a hostage?

ND: Yes.

SM: Is there special training on how you would speak to those type of people? Is there anything that you are looking for to try and convey to them.

ND: There is stuff that you say that we learned in the FBI academy but there is also what you learn in the training about different ways to talk to people to see how they react and what connections or hooks work. (We) try to build a report with the person to get them out of the predicament that they are in whether it be a hostage, barricaded, or suicidal (subject).

SM: You try and diffuse the situation?

ND: Right.

SM: What is the ultimate goal of that?

ND: To get everybody out unharmed and safe.

SM: So for about two years that you have been on the team, how many incidents would you say that you have been involved in?

ND: seven.

SM: Wow, that's good. Within your nine years obviously you went to the police academy successfully back in 2003-2004. Do you attend various updated training on different topics over the last nine plus years as an officer?

ND: Yes.



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SM: That includes CPT. Within that training are there courses that people come in and speak to officers about CPR, first aid, mentally ill.

ND: Yes.

SM: And you attended those updated training on those subjects?

ND: Yes.

SM: Today, the 19th, this morning, can you tell me about how you became involved in this particular situation on 43rd Street?

ND: Prior to the call on 43rd Street there was a call that came out at 53rd and Folsom that I responded to regarding a male subject by the same name. (He) was possibly in a restaurant parking lot possibly feeling suicidal and it was an all units broadcast that I was to respond to check the area for the subject. There was no clothing description and just a basic description of a male white, bald head, walking around the area. We didn't have a phone number to contact him and I think that his mom called it in and was worried about his welfare. I responded and checked all the parking lots, drove around the neighborhood, looked up and down the streets and I could not find him so I cleared the call, unable to locate. It was just an all units broadcast and not a report call.

SM: Were you the only unit that was dispatched to that original call at 51st and Folsom.

ND: Yes.

SM: Was it specific to 51st and Folsom.

ND: It was 50 something and Folsom to that specific area.

SM: Do you remember what the gentleman's name was that was on the call.

ND: Robert. A male white, heavy, bald, and I think 38 (years old), unknown on clothing.

SM: You mentioned that mom had called it in? So that would have been the reporting party. Were there any details from mom on the call about why he was suicidal?

ND: Yes, I guess that he had just lost his brother. His brother had just died but I don't know the details of that or when (that happened).

SM: Did mom mention in the call on how she thought that Robert was going to commit suicide?



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ND: No, she stated that he had tried to commit suicide in the past by hanging himself I believe. But he had tried in the past and she thinks that he might be suicidal now. There were no indicators of weapons, or how, none of that information was given.

SM: You go out there and check around the area. Were you by yourself when you did this?

ND: Yes.

SM: No other cover unit, it was just an all units?

ND: Right.

SM: What is the difference between an all units and another type of call?

ND: A report call would be where I would write documentation.

SM: Would it be normal for an all units or a call like this to just have one officer go out and check around?

ND: If an officer is available. Sometimes an officer does not even respond. If you are in the area and you happen to see..

SM: It's kind of a lower priority vs. something that is in-progress type call. Do you remember about what time that one came out?

ND: No. eightish?

SM: You clear that one, do you handle any other calls between that one and the next one?

ND: Yes. I handled one more call and then I go and gas up the car because it is on empty. I do a unit status and I see that two other officers are in my beat and I pull up the call. I see that is the same name of the subject of the all units (call). I tell dispatch to show me enroute to help them.

SM: When you pull up the call and you see the other two units where is that call and what type of call is it that you see?

ND: It was 981 check or a 927P. I see that Ofc. Callahan and Baker are both on it and it is over off of Elvis but I'm not sure exactly where on Elvis.

SM: Is that this call?

ND: Same one.



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SM: Do you read the text on the call.

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- ND: I read most of it but I don't think that I read it from beginning to the end.
- SM: Do you see similarities between it and the all units call.
- ND: Yes, same name.
- SM: It would be the same person that you were looking for.
- ND: Yes, same description and he is suicidal.

SM: Does this new call that Ofc. Callahan and Baker are on, is that at a particular location or is it in the general area?

ND: I never made it out there so I don't know. I know it was like Elvas, I want to say Elvas, but I am not sure.

- SM: Is it the same type of call as the all units?
- ND: Yes.

SM: You mentioned 981 and you and I both know what that is.

ND: Welfare check.

SM: 927P is?

ND: Suspicious circumstance.

SM: That is another type of a call. Now you are enroute over to the call with (Officer) Callahan and Baker. What happens next?

ND: I am enroute and Dee (Ofc. Baker) and I send MDC messages back and forth. (I ask) am I needed at the scene and what can I do to help or what do you want me to do or respond to. Callahan or Baker sends a message that he might be possibly in the area of 43rd and J (Street) or J Street. I said that I would go check the area since I was not far from there.

SM: So they tell you that he may be in the area of 43rd and J (Street) and is there any updated information on the call as to how he made it there or any additional info about him?

ND: No, not that I know of.



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SM: What happens next?

ND: I am driving west bound on M Street so I am coming northbound on 43rd Street. When I turn northbound on 43rd Street I see a male subject walking toward me walking southbound. As I get closer I realize that (he) matches the description of the male subject that I am looking for. He is walking southbound on the west curb line sidewalk. As I am approaching him I can see his eyes are very big and he immediately starts yelling, I am not going with and I know what you are here for, I am not going to go back. I say, hey, I just want to talk to you. (He says), no I am not going to talk to you. When I approach with my car there is a good distance and my window is rolled down. I am talking out my window and he walks at a fast pace and he starts to pass my car. I speed up and do a U-turn because I can't see him anymore. It is now an officer safety (issue) and no longer a contact that you would come on a regular basis with somebody. As I am doing a U-turn I am watching him and when I turned around he turns his head and looks back at me and sees me turning around. He starts running southbound.

SM: As you make this contact with him and you have this dialogue and he says that he is not going with you, I know what you are here for, what is your response to him?

ND: At that point I am thinking, why is he saying these things? He said something like I am not going back and that makes me think that he knows why I am there obviously and maybe there is a 5150 mental health history. I know from that statement, that because he may have a 5150 history in the past that he may not go along with the program and he may not be cooperative. I ask him to stop and he did not, he kept walking. At that point I know that he wouldn't be cooperative with me.

SM: You make the U-turn and he takes off running on you. At any time from the initial contact in the car can you see his hands?

ND: No.

SM: What happens next?

ND: I catch up to him in my car and I grab my radio to put it out where it happened and as I am doing that he stops in a grassy yard of a house. As he turns sideways he has a big knife to his stomach. I put it out (radio) that I have him, I didn't know the address, but I put out something and I don't even remember what I said and that he had a knife to his stomach or in his hands.

SM: Describe that knife?

ND: About 12 inches like a cutting knife. A long butcher type knife.

SM: Like the biggest knife in your butcher block at home.



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ND: Yes, but it's not triangle, It's like a ?.

ONLY

SM: Not a meat cleaver but the biggest knife (in block), got it. Is he backing away from you towards?

ND: As I get out of the car and I put it out he runs to the house in the yard that he is standing in. I follow him. I'm telling him to put the knife down and I just want to talk and he runs up to the front door and starts pounding on the door. At that point I pull out my taser because I can see the other officer, Callahan, is pulling up at the exact same time. He tells me, I got lethal and I said that I am going to tase him. We were telling him to put down the knife and we just want to talk. He is just not even listening to us.

SM: Are both of you guys talking to him?

ND: I don't know if Mark was or not. I think that he was letting me talk, but I don't know.

SM: You are saying put down the knife?

ND: We just want to talk and everything was going to be ok. He keeps yelling, I don't want to go back and I know what you want to do with me. We just kept playing the back and forth and then when he pounded on the door and he turned on us and he had something in his hand. It was something small but I couldn't see like fit in his fist. He put it up to his neck and I heard him to start yelling. I couldn't see what it was but he was like in pain.

SM: Was it that big knife that you had seen earlier?

ND: No, it was something that fit in his hand. I couldn't quite make out what was going on but he was yelling like he was in pain. It was like raaarrrhhhh, like screaming, I am like what is going on? He moved his hand and I saw blood but I couldn't see what was in his hand so I tased him. I thought it was a small pocket knife or something. At one point he fell point but he was able to get right back up. The taser wasn't working.

SM: And he is still at the front door?

ND: He is at the front door. At that point I am thinking in my head that it is not just me that I have to be concerned about or him, it is (also) the people in the house. I don't know whose house this is and I don't know his relationship to this house, and then my partner. He puts whatever it was up to his neck again and starts yelling again. I am seeing more blood. Callahan, I ask him, do you have any more (taser) cartridges because I used mine up and it didn't work or had no effect on him. Callahan hands me his taser and he says, I have lethal I will give you my taser. I take his taser and try to tase him again. He is yelling and he is able to get up and run away from us.

SM: Let me ask you a little bit about those sequence of events. At the door when you initiate that first taser, could you tell if those darts hit him, in his clothing, could you tell where they went?



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ND: I know that they hit him somewhere but I don't know where. I could see that the wires were going around and were still attached to something.

- SM: How far away from him were you upon that first taser shot?
- ND: Maybe 10 feet, 10-12 feet.
- SM: Between that 10-12 feet are there any obstructions between you?
- ND: No. Well, there was a bush.
- SM: That low hedge bush.
- ND: But that was not in the way of the taser darts.

SM: As far as you could tell those (darts) attached to him? When you cycled (taser) through, did you notice any effects of that?

ND: He went down but he was still moving. I don't know if he went down because of the noise and it freaked him out or?

- SM: Did he go down to his stomach, to his knees?
- ND: His bottom.
- SM: He sat back?
- ND: He was standing and he just went back into the corner against the door.
- SM: Did you cycle more than once on the first (taser)?
- ND: No.
- SM: Once he is down on his bottom did he pop back up on his own?

ND: He started to get back up again and that is when I took the other taser.

SM: At this point, when he starts to come back up, when you cycle the first initial taser, is he saying anything or making any noises?

ND: He does a lot of yelling but I don't know.



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SM: Incoherent yelling or yelling like he is in pain from the cuts to his neck?

ND: That is probably what it was, the cuts, because everything that he said was pretty coherent. It was a lot of yelling and he kept trying to cut his neck with whatever was in his hand.

SM: Is he still going back into his neck?

ONLY

ND: Yes.

SM: Before I move you on I want to bring you back. You have the initial call where this person is suicidal whose mom is calling in and is concerned enough to have the police look for him. The second call where other officers are responding and they respond. If I am getting this wrong please tell me. You get on the call and mark onscene and see a guy that matches the description and have specific training in hostage negotiations to deal with suicidal subjects. You are doing your contact with him based on some of that training and he runs to the house. You mentioned something that I want to follow up on, at this point where he runs to the house and just before you fire that initial taser shot, what were your concerns?

- ND: Who was in the house.
- SM: So, you had concerns for the safety of the people in the house. Did you have concerns about your safety?

ND: Yes.

SM: Why is that?

ND: Because he had weapons and I?

SM: The weapon being the 12 inch knife that you had seen originally and he had something in his other hand that you could not tell (what it was).

ND: Right.

SM: It was the other hand and you couldn't tell (what it was), and he was actually cutting himself, is that correct?

ND: Right.

- SM: That was actually starting to bleed.
- ND: Right.
- SM: And is it at that point that you decided that you were going to tase him?



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- ND: Yes.
- SM: And you did that because?

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- ND: For his safety. I didn't want him to harm himself further and if he turned on me or my partner.
- SM: Absolutely. Would you consider that kind of a life saving action?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: You attended the taser training?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: Do you remember when that was?
- ND: No. Last year.

SM: The initial shot went off and you cycled through and you asked Ofc. Callahan for his taser right?

ND: I asked him for extra cartridges and he hands me his taser.

SM: What happens next.

ND: After I did mine and it had no effect on him he started to get up again and move like he was not coming toward me but get up in a manner that he was going to take off running or move or standup. I fired the second cartridge and it had no effect on him at all and he took off running. He stood up and ran to the side of the house.

SM: The second cartridge is fired from Ofc. Callahan's taser. The second cartridge that you fired but the first that was fired from Callahan's taser?

ND: Yes.

SM: The same thing, you see the darts go to their mark?

ND: Yes.

SM: And you hear the cycle of the taser?

ND: Yes.

SM: And does that cycle cause him to go back down to his bottom or anything?



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ND: No.

SM: And he takes off running?

ND: Yes.

- SM: And where does he run to?
- ND: He runs to the south side of the house where the driveway is.

SM: What happens next?

ND: He runs down the driveway to the gate and he runs up against the house. At this point, (Officer) Callahan and I chase after him. We yell at him to stop and again he is yelling back at us. He is telling us to go away. He uses something and he breaks the window to the house. The window is, to him it was probably chest (high) to him. When he breaks the window he jumps in the window and at that point I start to worry about him getting in the house and the safety of anybody in the house and his relation to the house. At that point I knew that he didn't belong in the house because he didn't have the keys and he was pounding on the doors. I almost shoot him. I start to move the trigger on my gun and at that point he falls out of the window.

SM: Could you tell if he breaks the window with his elbow or his head?

ND: I don't think it was the thing that was in his hand. It looked like it was with his hand. It could have been elbow but I saw his arm (indicating striking motion with arm).

SM: Does the window fall in totally?

ND: It smashes.

- SM: And he tries to actually get in?
- ND: He gets in to his chest and he is hanging outside the window.
- SM: Do you still have the taser?
- ND: No, my gun. I dropped the taser and pulled out my gun.
- SM: Is he saying anything or making any noises?

ND: No.



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SM: Throughout this portion can you tell if he continues to bleed?

ND: No.

- SM: He's in the window, you say that he comes back out?
- ND: It looks like he falls out.

ONLY

SM: What happens next?

ND: Another officer arrives onscene, Ofc. Baker. We tell her that we are out of (taser) cartridges and to get some. She has one and she also tases him. Let me go back, when he came out of the window, I saw what he had in his hand fall out.

- SM: What was that?
- ND: It was a little box cutter. A little metal 6 inch (box cutter).
- SM: So it was a box cutter.
- ND: Yes.
- SM: How were you able to see that, did he drop that?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: He dropped that when he was going in or out of the window?
- ND: At one point it hit the ground so I don't know if he threw it or what.

SM: So he comes out of the window and drops or throws the box cutter. Ofc. Baker comes up and deploys her CED. Were you able to tell if that deployment of that taser was effective?

- ND: It looked like it made contact with his clothes but it did not phase him.
- SM: What was his bodily response?
- ND: Yelling, like ahhhhhh.
- SM: So like a crazy man yell or an I'm in pain yell.
- ND: I don't think it was a pain yell. At this point he had the knife in his hand.



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- SM: So the box cutter is away and he has the knife. Does he brandish it at you guys?
- ND: No, he was cutting himself at his neck.

ONLY

- SM: Did you actually see it start to go in?
- ND: He is sawing (on neck).
- SM: A sawing motion across his neck.
- ND: Yes.
- SM: Is he still outside of the window?
- ND: He had stayed below the window on the ground. He hadn't moved from that position.
- SM: Now I remember seeing a silver Honda in the driveway. Was this down in front of that car?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: So this was all (happening) between that car and the back fence.
- ND: That is where he was at the back fence.
- SM: Is he up on his feet?
- ND: No, when he fell out of the window he stayed down low, like he was crouching down low and he stayed in that position.
- SM: He is sawing his neck and are you seeing blood starting to come up?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: So this is effective for him.
- ND: Yes.
- SM: What happens next?

ND: He moves the knife to the center of his throat and starts jabbing. More officers come up and I think it was Ofc. Zeek because I remember hearing his voice. We are saying tasers, and they had tasers so it must have been



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him and (Officer) Warren. They tased and still nothing. He was still stabbing himself in the neck and cutting his neck.

SM: Are those jabs real short or are they strong enough to get in there?

ND: They are short and strong at that time. He was making a lot of noises at that point like he was in pain. I could tell that he was feeling it.

SM: Are you or any of the other officers giving him commands?

ND: The entire time. If I wasn't a male voice was. At that point I went into HNT mode.

SM: What does that mean?

ND: I used my active listening skills and I tried talking to him. I know that us just yelling at him wasn't working. I began telling him, I don't want to hurt you and I just want to talk to you. Why don't you tell me what is going on. It looked like he was making eye contact with me. Before it was like crazy eyes and I kept doing it and talking to him, like tell me what is going on and I kept trying to build report with him. He had a knife in his hand right in front of him and I found the more that I was talking to him he would lower the knife. I continued talking to him and I had (Officer) Baker there who was coaching me. She was saying, keep it up and you are doing fine. I told him that it makes me really nervous when you hold the knife like that and I don't want you to hurt me and you don't want to hurt me do you? He started communicating with me but it was with head shakes and nods. He tried talking to me but he could not communicate because, I am assuming that it was probably blood filling up his lungs. When he was talking nothing was coming out but he was trying to talk to me.

SM: So his lips were moving?

ND: It was a whisper. I said, do you want to talk to me? He nodded, yes. He would point at the other officers. I said, you don't want to talk to them? He shook his head no. Another officer came up behind me and I think it freaked him out. He snapped out of whatever it was and grabbed the knife and started to forcefully stab his neck with the butcher knife to the point where blood was going everywhere.

SM: After that attempt at using your active listening skills and those stabbing motions are there any more tasers deployed that you remember?

ND: At that point an officer pulled out the bean bag (shotgun). I don't know who it was and it could have been (Officer) Frazer. An officer used the bean bag (shotgun), I think four times that hit him and it put it on his back to a seated position. He was on his back a little bit but he was still able to move around. He still would not stop the stabbing to his neck.

SM: So he gets hit four times with the bean bag and after those he continues to stab himself in the neck?



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ND: Yes. I think that there was another taser shot but I don't know who it was from. It didn't phase him.

SM: What happens next?

ND: We continue to yell at him to put the knife down and we need to help him, but we can't help him unless he puts the knife down. He takes the knife and puts it somewhere in his chest. It looks like he stabs his chest and I don't know if it went through his arm or his side. It looked like he just stabbed himself in the chest. I saw several movements and I don't know how deep the knife went in but it looked like it went in.

SM: Are there any more tasers used?

ND: I think that was all.

SM: Any more bean bags?

ND: No.

SM: Does anybody fire their weapon?

ND: No.

SM: Baton strikes?

ND: No. There was no way that we can get close enough.

SM: Pepper spray, does anybody deploy pepper spray?

ND: No.

SM: How are you guys able to get him safely into custody?

ND: After the stabbing to the neck. This was all within minutes, after that and the bean bag, his body went limp. I ran up and kicked the knife away and it went under the gate out of everybody's reach. Another officer grabbed him by his legs and pulled him away. I looked down and blood was just coming out everywhere from his neck. One officer applies pressure and I immediately start chest compressions, CPR.

SM: Somebody applies pressure to the neck wounds and do you remember who that was?

ND: No, but there was officers behind me and I think from his angle he could not get enough pressure so another officer in front of me took over and applied pressure. So, two officers were applying pressure to his neck at one point.



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SM: And you start chest compressions?

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ND: Yes.

SM: When you are doing the chest compressions are you feeling or noticing any wetness from blood on his chest?

ND: No.

- SM: Who call fire?
- ND: I don't know.
- SM: Do they show up?

ND: Yes.

- SM: Was he loaded into the ambulance?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: And transported?

ND: Yes.

SM: Was there a Sergeant onscene on this?

ND: Yes.

- SM: Who was that?
- ND: Sgt. Bell.
- SM: Is that your Sergeant?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: 2 Sam 3.
- ND: Yes.
- SM: Would Sgt. Bell be the one who had the shotgun to shoot the bean bag?



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ND: Yes.

SM: Let me go ahead and check. (To Sean Howell) Do you have anything?

SH: Did you lose any equipment off your duty belt or any equipment that you normally bring during the entire incident?

- ND: I lost my taser and my watch and I left my flashlight onscene.
- SH: Let's talk about your watch. Where ever you watch fell off do you know where it is at?

ND: Yes.

- SH: Did you move it from where it initially fell off when you saw it?
- ND: I took it off because it was covered in blood.
- SH: And you sat it down somewhere. What about your flashlight, where did you find that?
- ND: After the chest compressions on the guy, it was on the ground covered in his blood.
- SH: So it was close to his body right?
- ND: Yes. I picked it up and cleaned it off and sat it in the driveway to dry off.
- SH: Where ever it is found right now is not the original place that it was and you wiped it off, correct?

ND: Yes.

- SM: Your watch is what color?
- ND: Pink and gray.
- SM: I do remember seeing the pink watch out there in the driveway toward the end. So that one is yours?

ND: Yes.

- SM: Was your flashlight a small one?
- ND: Yes.
- SH: Was there any other equipment?



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- ND: Taser.
- SH: And the taser was where?
- ND: Right where I fired it by the bushes in front of the front door.
- SH: What about your partner's taser that you fired, where did you put that?
- ND: I don't remember. I dropped it and I think that another officer picked it up from the same area.
- SH: And finally how about the rest of your uniform, is it damaged in any way?
- ND: Covered in blood.
- SH: Your pants?
- ND: Yes.
- SM: Did they get photographs of that?

ND: She took photographs but I don't know. (We examined her pants and noticed blood spots on her pants). I had kneeled down by him on the ground.

- SM: Do you remember what car you were in?
- ND: It was the one that was angled.
- SM: Do you know if your ICC was on?
- ND: It was not.

(I showed Officer Duckham two photographs of the scene taken from Google earth. She indicated where she originally saw the subject about five houses north of 43rd Street. She also indicated on a separate photograph where the confrontation took place in the front yard of 43rd Street. I later booked these photographs into evidence).

(I left the room at 1633 hours).

- (I returned at 1637 hours).
- SM: What kind of watch was that?



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ND: A cheap Wal-Mart watch.

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- SM: I can get that back to you today if you want it.
- ND: It was covered in blood so I don't want it.

SM: That was my next question. Your flashlight, obviously they booked that so we will get that back to you and the taser I will get back to you too. The only thing that I need to do with that is to download the memory from the Captain's computer. We can get that back to you today. Did he say if you are going to get three days off.

ND: Yes.

SM: Then I can for sure have it for you then. You go back to work?

ND: Tuesday.

SM: So before you go back to work next week but I may be able to get it back to you today.

- ND: I am end of watch now.
- SM: Right. Any other questions?

(Conversation about cleaning pants or replacing them).

SM: I will write everything for you and you don't need to write anything. I will do your statement and send it to him (Howell) and then it will come back.

SH: They will transcribe it and email it to me and I will contact and email it to you. We will let them know if there are any corrections.

ND: Ok.

(End of interview).

Witness Statement: Officer Zeek

On 1-19-13, at approximately 1552 hours, I contacted Officer Ethan Zeek in interview room #4 at 5770 Freeport Blvd and interviewed him regarding what he observed earlier in the day at 43rd St. Attorney Gabriel Quinnan represented Officer Ethan Zeek and was present during the interview. The following interview was DVD/DVR recorded and a copy of the recording was later booked as evidence. The recording is available for transcription if necessary. Officer Ethan Zeek related the following in summary:

Trimpey: Tell me how long you have been an officer, your current assignment and what time you started today?

Zeek: It will be 14 years next month. I am currently assigned to the bike unit and I am working my normal shift today which started at 0600.

Trimpey: Tell me how long you have carried a tazer and your experiences with the tazer and its effectiveness?

Zeek: I was one of the first officers to get the old tazer the M26 as part of the test group. I have carried a tazer ever since. I have deployed my tazer before and I have seen it work. I saw it work with prongs at least three times and once I saw it work with a guy on PCP who was rubbing feces on himself. I have seen the tazer work perfectly every time.

Trimpey: Can you please explain to me what type of call you responded to this morning, where you came from and what you did, if anything, once you arrived?

Zeek in summary: Warren and I were in our office at 3rd and K St when we started walking to the underground parking garage on K St. We were walking to our patrol car to conduct our park check at Caesar Chavez Park when I heard Officer Duckham say that she had a subject with a knife to his stomach. I looked to Warren and told him that we should go to her call. The next thing I heard was that the units needed more tazer cartridges so we started running to the car. Once we got to the car we drove code 3 down J St to 43rd St. I was the passenger in the vehicle while we were en route and I heard a male voice, whom I have since learned was Officer Callaghan, say over the air to get a hold of the occupants of the house because they thought the subject may try and enter the house.

Since we didn't have a computer in the car I switched to channel 4 and asked for the actual address of Bravo 38's call. Once we had the address I knew that we had to turn south on 43rd St. Once we turned south onto 43rd St and I saw police cars parked on 43rd St. Upon arrival I saw Butler, Duckham, Baker and Callaghan

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standing in front of the Honda which was in the driveway of the house. Duckham was talking to the guy and I knew that she was HNT. It was either Callaghan or Baker to say back up because we were agitating the guy. Warren and I backed up so we could see what was going on but the subject couldn't see us. I remember for the limited time we were up there that the subject had a knife to his throat and he had blood on his neck. I switched my radio to the fire channel and told them to stage at 43rd and M St because the street was blocked to the north of the house. I wanted them to come in from the south.

I saw Warren, Frazier and Bell towards the trunk of someone's car and I heard someone talking about the bean bag shotgun so that is what I thought they were doing. At this time I heard people yelling for the subject to drop the knife and then I heard the sounds of a tazer being deployed. I ran back to where the incident was occurring and I pulled my tazer out. I saw the subject was bleeding more from the neck and he had tazer wires coming from his body. The subject started rolling on the ground with his head towards us and he had the knife out pointed in our direction to keep us away from him. The subject was kind of spinning. I believe Callaghan had his gun out to my right and Cynthia Bohrer ran up to my left. I believe everyone else was to my right. I saw that he didn't have any tazer prongs in his legs and I could tell he was trying to push up to try and get off the ground and his feet were towards us. I saw him stab his stomach and he was using his free hand to try and push the knife deeper into his chest. I heard someone say to taze his legs because I think they thought they weren't getting good contact. I could tell the tazer wasn't having the effect that I had seen it have in the past.

At that point, I thought I was the only one who had a fresh cartridge so I deployed my tazer and aimed at his buttocks. I thought it would be the most effective area. I kept looking at my tazer to see if it was working because I was hearing other tazers arcing around me so I actually looked at the display to make sure it was working.

I told people the other officers on scene that we needed people with gloves because I knew eventually we would have to go up and put hands on this guy because eventually he was going to drop the knife or at least I hoped he would eventually drop the knife. I knew that I had gloves on and I wanted at least one additional person to have gloves on so I didn't have to go up alone. Warren told me that he had gloves on too. I don't remember if this was before or after I heard the bean bag shotgun deployed by Frazier. The first two rounds from the bean bag shotgun were deployed in rapid succession and struck the subject in the chest. At that point the subject was stabbing himself in the stomach and when he was hit with the bean bag rounds he started to stab himself in the eye. I told Frazier to try and shoot him in the hand so he would drop the knife but that didn't work. All the officers kept arcing our tazers and shouting commands for Robert to drop the knife and stop stabbing himself in the knife. Robert started stabbing himself in the neck again and he was going deeper into his neck now. I saw the dark blood start coming out and he stopped moving and I saw his hand fall across his body and land on the ground on the right side of his person. I saw his hand open and he let go of the knife but his hand was still moving.

I stepped forward and grabbed his left ankle to pull him away from the knife at the same time Duckham walked over and kicked the knife away from him and under the fence. I saw Duckham kneel down next to him and start doing CPR and I saw Warren around his neck area and I couldn't really see what he was

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doing. I walked away towards the street and my radio was still on fire channel so I requested them to come in and told them that the subject had stabbed himself in the neck and we needed them to come in code 3 to render aid. I walked back to where the officers were rendering aid and I could see Frazier was at the subject's neck and he was applying pressure to his wound and Duckham was still performing CPR. I saw a knit cap on the ground and I thought Frazier could use the knit cap to apply pressure to the wound on the subject's neck or bandaging. Frazier said he didn't need the knit cap. I had previously heard a female yelling for Robert to stop so I went back to the street and made sure she didn't come into the scene. At that time I saw the fire department come in so I started to set up crime scene tape.

Trimpey: At this point I utilized a Google map view of 43rd St and had Officer Zeek illustrate where he was on the map. (The map was later booked as evidence)

Zeek in summary: The subject is kind of up in the corner of the house and the fence. After we were told to back off we walked to the area near the sidewalk where the pavers are. Zeek marked on the map where he was standing when he

Trimpey: Do you remember what the subject looked like?

Zeek in summary: I remember he was a 35-40 year old male white wearing blue jeans and a long sleeve shirt that was a little thicker which may have caused the tazers to be ineffective.

Trimpey: Why do you think he was rolling when he first walked up?

Zeek: I think the rolling was similar to what I have seen on videos of people who are trying to break the wires. I could tell that the subject was in control of his actions so it wasn't the tazer that was causing him to roll. The subject tried to get up but the officers started cycling their tazers again and this caused him to fall back down and begin rolling again back towards the house. The subject kind of flipped from having his head towards me when he first was rolling to having his feet towards me when he was rolling back in the other direction.

Trimpey: Do you remember how many times you cycled your tazer?

Zeek in summary: I deployed my tazer and then I cycled the tazer an additional 3-4 times.

Trimpey: How was he stabbing himself in the neck?

Zeek in summary: He was taking his right hand to his left collar bone in a motion that was across his body. The subject got the knife into his throat and he was really moving it around and that is when I saw the dark blood coming out of his neck. It was seconds later that he kind of went limp and his arm dropped to his side. I grabbed his leg and pulled him away because he was still close enough to the knife that he could have easily reacquired the knife.

Trimpey: Is there anything about this incident that you know about that we didn't go over?



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Zeek: No. I wish we had contacted the security guard who was standing on the perimeter to thank him because he was keeping people back and that really helped but he took off.



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

I've been a sworn officer on the department for approximately eight years. I'm currently assigned to patrol, North area day shift.

I was on my way to the Kinney Police Facility to use the restroom. Sometime right before, or right about the time I arrived there, I heard a radio call about a suicidal subject downtown. I was just outside the gate of the facility when I saw another patrol car depart "code-3" to that call. I followed that patrol car to the downtown call.

While I was enroute to the call, I heard several updates on the radio. Officers were requesting "code-3 cover" because the subject was stabbing himself. At that point, another officer got on the radio to request more officers and more tasers because they were running low on cartridges, so I continued to the scene.

Just before I arrived, I was driving on J Street approaching 43rd Street. Another officer got on the radio and told everybody to reduce from code-3 driving. I was right around the corner, so I just continued to the scene. I turned southbound on 43rd Street from J Street and Sergeant Bell was driving in front of me toward the scene. We arrived at the same time. I parked my car directly behind Sgt. Bell's, a couple of houses north of the scene. I got out of the car, and ran to the scene where I could see a couple of officers standing near some bushes. I had my taser out by this time.

I ran up to where the officers were. I saw maybe four or five officers engaging POMARES. Some officers had their tasers out. Others had their firearm out. Officer Warren was kind of standing back behind the cars in the driveway with Officer Matthew. Officer Matthew was standing behind the car in the driveway of the scene, and Officer Warren was standing behind the car in the driveway of the house next door to the south. They asked me to put my taser away. They already had their tasers up, and they were kind of standing back so other officers could deal with POMARES. I was approximately 30 feet east of POMARES. I could see him through the space between the two parked cars in the driveways.

I saw that Officer Duckham was standing almost in front of POMARES, facing him. I saw other officers standing next to Officer Duckham just south of her. Officer Duckham was talking to POMARES, trying to convince him to put down the knife. I don't recall exactly what else she was saying. From what I heard all the communication between the officers and POMARES was understandable, but he didn't respond to any of the communications.

I saw POMARES sitting down with a knife in his hand, and there was blood on his neck. Officer Duckham was trying to talk to POMARES to get him to drop the knife. He was just flailing wildly with the knife from a seated



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position. That's why none of the officers tried to approach him. It looked like POMARES was trying to keep everybody away from him, and that was effective.

At some point, POMARES tried to stand up with the knife still in his hand, like he was going to go towards the officers. Several officers discharged their tasers.

Officer Matthew and I approached closer, along the white pillars next to the driveway of the house to the south. Another officer motioned to us that our approach made POMARES nervous or something. I don't know if they could hear exactly what POMARES was saying, but we retreated back a little bit. There was a tree at the east end of that driveway south of POMARES. I stood behind the tree, but I couldn't get a clear view of POMARES until I kneeled down. He wasn't saying anything or making any noises.

Somebody said "Try to shoot his legs," because most of the other tasers where hitting POMARES' body, and they wanted to get a taser fired at his legs. I got into position to target POMARES' legs. I saw POMARES start to get up with the knife outstretched. It looked like he was going to charge at Officer Duckham, so I discharged my taser at his buttocks and legs. I'd say I was approximately six to eight feet away from POMARES when I discharged my taser. I told POMARES to "Drop the knife, don't do this to yourself." I don't know what the other officers were saying. I don't remember anyone saying anything else. It appeared to me that POMARES was suicidal and didn't want to respond to anyone.

It looked like the taser worked because it caused POMARES to fall to the ground again. I felt like I needed to do this to keep POMARES from stabbing himself. I could see that he was already injured. I don't know if he had cut himself, but I did see that he was already injured in the neck before I arrived. I could see blood around his neck.

POMARES was still trying to slash himself in the neck or face. We were all trying to get him to drop the knife. POMARES tried to stab himself in the eye. I remember I tried to cycle my taser again when he was trying to stab himself in the eye. Eventually, POMARES did stab himself in the eye. He had both hands on the knife and he pointed it right at his eye and stabbed himself. I remember waiting about five seconds before cycling my taser again because I wanted to see if he would drop the knife right before he stabbed himself in the eye. My taser didn't appear to have an effect on him except that he tensed up right before he stabbed himself.

Sometime after that, POMARES dropped the knife. I didn't see if anything was done that prompted him to drop the knife. He was sitting up a flailing around. I heard the pops of the bean bag shotgun right before that, so I don't know if that's what caused him to drop the knife. I didn't see which officer fired the bean bag rounds. I know that someone had asked for the bean bag shotgun, but I don't know who deployed it until after the incident. I think that it was necessary to use the bean bag rounds because the tasers didn't seem to be working at all. They didn't cause POMARES to drop the knife or anything.

The officers then rushed to POMARES. Officer Duckham was able to kick the knife away from his hand. Other officers performed CPR on POMARES until the paramedics arrived. I tried to get some gloves on because four or five other officers had already started CPR. At that point, I believed I couldn't offer any further services, so I ran back to my car to get crime scene tape.



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I used one taser cartridge only. I did not perform any first aid. The officers that I can remember giving first aid to POMARES was Officer Duckham, I think Officer Warren, and I think it was Officer Frazer. That's what I remember. The only one I remember for sure doing something specific was Officer Duckham. She was doing CPR chest compressions. One of the officers had a hand on POMARES' neck wound. Someone else was holding POMARES' head, but I don't know what they were doing.

The taser I used is one of the tasers left at the scene.

On 1-19-13, at approximately 1642 hours, I contacted Officer Jason Warren in interview room #4 at 5770 Freeport Blvd and interviewed him regarding what he observed earlier in the day at 43rd St. Attorney Gabriel Quinnan represented Officer Jason Warren and was present during the interview. The following interview was DVD/DVR recorded and a copy of the recording was later booked as evidence. The recording is available for transcription if necessary. Officer Jason Warren related the following in summary:

Warren: I have been a police officer since 1997 and I am currently assigned to the bike unit. I have been on the bike unit for 3 i years.

Trimpey: Can you please explain to me what type of call you responded to this morning, where you came from and what you did, if anything, once you arrived?

Warren in summary: Officer Zeek and I were at 312 K St and were about to perform our regular park check. I heard the call come out and the officer said that the subject had a knife to his stomach. Zeek and I heard the call on our radio and could tell things were getting more intense so we started to walk quickly to our car and once we got to our car we drove code-3 to 43rd St. I drove the car directly down J St to 43rd St and turned south on 43rd St. I parked about a house prior to where the incident was at which was as close as I could get. I saw Callaghan had his gun out and I don't think Natalie had any weapons. I heard Natalie say to the guy, "Oh are they scaring you?" I could see the guy had a knife in his hand and the knife had an approximate 8" blade with 6 inches of blood on the blade. I saw the guy was pointing the knife towards his stomach and then towards his neck and continued back and forth. Natalie motioned Zeek and I to move back so we went to the rear of the Honda which was in the driveway. Once we got to the back of the car a K9 officer arrived and Zeek motioned to her to stay back. Sgt. Bell arrived after the K9 officer and we told her what the situation was and as I was talking to Sgt. Bell I heard a "tazer" deployed and I heard commands from the officers telling the subject to "drop the knife."

Once I heard the "tazer" deployed I ran back to where the incident was occurring and I drew my "tazer." I could see the subject was still shoving the knife into his stomach and towards his neck. I saw the subject go rigid when the "tazer" was being deployed and he would stop harming himself. I saw once the "tazer" cycle ended the subject would begin moving the knife into his stomach and back towards his neck again. Based upon these facts I decided to deploy my "tazer." I deployed my "tazer" to try and save his life and I also wanted to protect my life and the lives of my partners because I knew at any time he could jump up and come at us. When I deployed my tazer the subject had actually shoved the knife into his chest and I felt that if I deployed my tazer he would stop harming himself because of what I had seen happen when he was "tazed" before.



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The tazing seemed like it was going on for a couple of minutes. At one point he made a growling noise and put the knife to his neck and shoved it into his neck. I remember he fell to the ground and I went limp. I went over to him because I had rubber gloves on and covered his neck trying to stop the bleeding. Natalie walked up and kicked the knife out of the way and then started to give the subject chest compressions. I was trying to stop the bleeding and checking for a pulse while we waited for fire to enter.

Trimpey: Do you remember what the guy looked like?

Warren in summary: Yes, he was male white, unshaven, 35 to 40 years old. The knife he was holding was a butcher or Rambo style knife. I remember the knife was pretty big and I think the blade was 8 inches and it was covered in blood.

Trimpey: What is the positioning of the officers like?

Warren: The subject was sitting near the broken window in the corner between the house and the fence. The subject was sitting on the ground and his chest was to the officers. I remember hearing officers give the subject commands to "drop the knife" and I heard Natalie talking to him saying things like "it's not that bad" and trying to talk the subject into giving up the knife. Once Officer Zeek and I were on scene I remember seeing Natalie, Callaghan, Tyndale and I believe Frazier was there too. I remember moving to the back of the Honda where I could see what was going on but the subject couldn't see us and become more agitated. I remember Sgt. Bell, a K9 officer and Ofc. Bohrer arrived shortly after we did.

Trimpey: Do you remember where you were standing when you deployed your "tazer?"

Warren in summary: Yes, I walked up to the driver's side of the car in the driveway and was standing in the general vicinity of the hood of the car. I believe Natalie was to my right and Officer Zeek was on the passenger side of the car.

Trimpey: What were the subject's actions?

Warren in summary: I don't remember ever seeing the subject waving the knife at any of the officers. I do remember him trying to get up a couple of times while we were standing out there after he was "tazed" but he never actually made it to his feet. I remember seeing him stop harm himself during the time a "tazer" was being deployed and then start harming himself again once the "tazer" cycle was done.

Trimpey: Do you remember hearing someone request the bean bag shotgun?

Warren: Yes.

Trimpey: Did you assist in getting the bean bag shotgun out of the car?



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Warren in summary: No, I didn't go get the bean bag shotgun out of any cars. At the time I was talking to Sgt. Bell at her arrival she was getting the bean bag shotgun out of the car.

Trimpey: Did you see the bean bag shotgun deployed?

Warren: Yes.

Trimpey: Did you see where the bean bags hit the subject?

Warren in summary: I think they hit him in the butt area and the side.

Trimpey: Did the bean bag shotgun have any effect? Warren: Zero effect.

Trimpey: Did you see where the subject was harming himself?

Warren in summary: I saw the subject stabbing himself in the stomach, the eye and the neck was the final blow. I saw the subject take the knife and put it to his stomach and shoved it into his stomach with both hands. I don't remember if he used one of two hands but he put the knife to his eye and pushed it in. I remember seeing the subject put the knife to his neck and push the knife from the bottom up into his neck.

Trimpey: What are your experiences with the "tazer" and their effect on people?

Warren: I have personally been "tazed" in training and I know from that experience that the "tazer" locks all of your muscles up and makes you go rigid. As a matter of fact, I remember when I deployed my "tazer" he was in the process of stabbing himself in the stomach. I remember deploying my "tazer" and watching him stop stabbing himself in the stomach during the "tazers cycle" and once the cycle was over the subject went back to stabbing himself in the stomach. I don't remember exactly where the my "tazer" prongs went but I was aiming for center mass. I know I had good contact because I saw the "tazer" have an effect. I cycled my "tazer" at least two additional times with the same "tazer" cartridge. What I mean by that is when you deploy your "tazer" and the prongs make good contact the "tazer" cycles for five seconds. If you need to continue deployment of the "tazer" you can depress the trigger and as long as the "tazer" prongs still have good contact the "tazer" will cycle through the person like it did the first time.

Trimpey: Have you previously deployed your "tazer" on duty?

Warren in summary: I have but it was ineffective because the subject was wearing three jackets.

Trimpey: At the time you responded to you hear someone ask for cover or did you hear someone ask for more "tazers?"



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Warren: I remember hearing units ask for code 3 and I remember a unit asking for additional "tazer" cartridges.

Trimpey: Tell me what happened when he put the knife to his neck?

Warren in summary: I remember him pushing the knife into his neck and the knife went in deep. I remember him falling backwards so his head went towards the fence and his feet were towards us. I remember as we approached him someone pulled him away from the fence by his feet and I believe this was Officer Zeek. I remember someone kicking the knife away from his person and I believe this was Natalie. I put my right hand on the subject's neck because it was pouring with blood and I put my other hand by his arm to find a pulse. Officer Frazier told me he would take the neck because he was in a better position and we held our positions until the fire department arrived. It felt like it took forever for the fire department to get there but it probably wasn't that long. Once the fire department arrived they took over for everyone.

Trimpey: Is there anything else that happened that I haven't asked you about?

Warren: No.

Witness Statement: Officer Tyson Butler

On 1-19-13, at approximately 1724 hours, I contacted Officer Tyson Butler in interview room #4 at 5770 Freeport Blvd and interviewed him regarding what he observed earlier in the day at 43rd St. Attorney Gabriel Quinnan represented Officer Tyson Butler and was present during the interview. The following interview was DVD/DVR recorded and a copy of the recording was later booked as evidence. The recording is available for transcription if necessary. Officer Tyson Butler related the following in summary:

Trimpey: Can you please explain to me what type of call you responded to this morning, where you came from and what you did, if anything, once you arrived?

Butler in summary: I have been a police officer since 2005 and I am normally not assigned to work downtown. This morning I was at the intersection of Alhambra/N St and I was not on any type of call for service. I heard Natalie Duckham say over the air that she was out with the subject and the subject still had the knife. I thought that I should pull up the call so I used my computer to pull up the call. As I was skimming the text of her call I saw that the subject was suicidal and armed with a knife. I pulled up the map and found out where she was because I don't normally work downtown. Once I found where the call was I started to drive in that direction but I didn't put myself on the call. While I was en route to the call I heard Dee say over the air that they needed more" tazer" cartridges on scene. I used my MDC to put myself on the call so I wasn't using up radio and I continued to drive in the direction of the call. Shortly after Dee said they needed more "tazer" cartridges I heard Callaghan come up on the air and say the units needed code 3. I turned on my lights and siren and I took the longest route possible, I think, because I kind of knew where I was going but I really didn't and I ended up making some wrong turns.

While I was still en route I knew there were three officers on scene already and they were asking for more "tazer" cartridges. Since there were three officers on scene I figured the suspect had already been "tazed" three times and I thought I should deploy my rifle.

I arrived and turned north onto 43rd St. Once I turned onto 43rd St I saw two police cars but I didn't see the officers. I kind of zigzagged my way through the cars and ended up parking directly in front of the driveway to the house where the officers were with the suspect. I exited my car and walked up to the three officers. I saw that Callaghan had his pistol out as lethal cover and Dee had a "tazer" which had already been deployed. I saw Natalie (Duckham) standing next to Dee and I saw that she was not armed. I thought Natalie was empty handed because she was trying to negotiate with the suspect and have him give up the knife. I set my bag with tazer cartridges on the hood of the car and I noticed a blood spot on the hood of the car. Once I noticed the blood spot on the hood of the car I realized how bad this situation was because the officers were not that close to the car and there was blood on the hood. I let Natalie know that I was standing next to her but she did not look





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at me because she was maintaining eye contact with the suspect. I turned and asked Dee what she needed and she told me that she needed additional "tazer" cartridges. I went to where I set my bag down and pulled out two tazer cartridges. I gave one to Dee and put the other one in my pocket.

I observed Robert was kind of squatted with his butt off the ground but his knees were up by his chest and his feet were on the ground. This is the first time that I could see the knife and I saw that it was a culinary style knife with a 9"blade and a 4" handle. Robert had both hands on the handle and the blade was under his chin. I could see blood on the knife and Robert was bleeding a lot but I couldn't tell where the knife was coming from. Natalie was talking to Robert and she was offering him the world. Robert just kept saying, "No, I am going to do this.' It seemed like they already had a little bit of information on him because Natalie would try to offer him something and the other officers would interject.

After a while the communication started to break down and Robert started making stabbing gestures while he was moving from side to side. Robert was crawling on all fours and wedged himself under a tree. At that time I felt that I had a clear shot with my "tazer" so I deployed it at Robert and the reaction I got from Robert was positive, meaning, the "tazer" seemed to make Robert stop stabbing himself. The "tazer" got him in a more upright position and all four of us figured that it was enough for us to gain control of Robert and all four of us had taken one step towards him. At this time, Robert started making a slashing movement towards us with the knife. Robert was bracing himself with one hand and slashing at us with the other. I think this surprised everybody and was kind of an "oh fuck" moment. After this the three of us were talking to each other and decided that if he got on his feet then we were going to shoot him because while he was in his crouch we kind of had him subdued but if he got to his feet he was definitely close enough to stab any of us.

I remember hearing other officers coming and I remember looking back and seeing Warren and Zeek. I told Warren to have the people who were on-lookers to keep back. I remember we were asking for the bean bag shotgun and trying to listen to Sgt. Bell.

During this time, Robert retreated from the tree back to where he was originally and took what I would consider to be one last breath. Robert put the knife to his chest and with both hands tried driving the knife into his chest. Everyone screamed and I was able to "taze" him again and got a positive response. Robert went rigid and he started to roll on the ground. Robert turned his back to us but he still had the knife in his hand and was making stabbing gestures to the right side of his neck. Once Robert rolled back onto his back I could see that he had a large gash to his neck and was bleeding a lot. I watched him make stabbing gestures to his body. I watched him stab himself in the eye. I watched him stab himself into the abdomen. I heard Frazier say shotgun and stood next to me and fired four rounds from the bean bag shotgun. All four rounds from the bean bag shotgun struck Robert and they were all good shots but they had minimal effect. After an additional two cycles from my "tazer" because my theory was as long as the "tazer" was cycling he was in a rigid state and not stabbing himself, my co-workers or me. I know I cycled my "tazer" numerous times. By the time Robert dropped the knife all the color had drained away from his face. Two people immediately gave medical aid to Robert and requested code 3 fire and placed pressure on the wound to his neck.



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I did render aid to Robert as well. I was standing next to Warren who was with Frazier when they were rendering aid. I saw that Frazier was trying to find a pulse on his left arm and I was holding down his shoulder.

Trimpey: Is there anything else you remember?

Butler in summary: I remember when I arrived at the scene I noticed the window at the house where this all took place was broken and I remember running scenarios through my head of what types of force I would use if Robert tried to get into the house.

Trimpey: How long have you carried a tazer?

Butler: I have carried a tazer since I became a police officer in 2005. I have carried the X26, which I presently carry, for three years but I have had a "tazer" on me since I became a police officer in 2005.

Trimpey: Have you every deployed your tazer?

Butler: Yes I have. I have deployed the "tazer" somewhere between 5 and 10 times. I have seen the "tazer" be effective and I have seen the "tazer" be ineffective. In my experience the "tazer" is ineffective when there is a poor probe placement due to thick clothing.

Trimpey: Do you remember what the person was wearing today?

Butler: I do, he was wearing jeans, a t-shirt and a thick Pendleton. The jacket was thick winter type clothing. The male was white in his 30's.

Trimpey: Is the Pendleton the type of clothing you have seen cause the "tazer" to be ineffective?

Butler: Yes.

Trimpey: Where exactly was the suspect when you arrived on scene?

Butler: The suspect was squatting in the corner where the fence and the house meet. The suspect's feet were flat on the ground but his butt was on the ground too and his knees were up to his chest. The only things I heard the suspect say was "no" and "I am going to do this."

I was directly in front of the hood of the car and Natalie was to my left and the house was to my right and the suspect was in front of me. I never gave the suspect any commands. Natalie was talking to him and was trying to get him to focus on her. I know as more people came the suspect became more agitated and Natalie was telling other officers to stay back so he wouldn't be so agitated. SACRAMENTO POLICE DEPARTMENT



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The suspect was crawling back to the corner where the house and fence meet when I deployed my "tazer." I aimed towards the small of his back and when I cycled my "tazer" I saw the suspect stop moving and his muscles went tense. After the "tazer" cycle, 5 seconds, the suspect would go back to what he was doing before. The suspect would go back to crawling if he was doing that before or he would go back to stabbing himself if that is what he was doing. I cycled my tazer four to five times.

The motion I saw the suspect make was a jab motion to his neck, chest, abdomen and eye ball. The motion was a slashing motion like you see in the movies it was more of a jabbing motion.

I heard I believe six different officers deploy their "tazer" at the suspect.

I am currently assigned as a patrol supervisor, downtown day-shift. I've been a sworn officer over 23 years.

I had gone up to the Kinney Police Facility because I needed to wash my patrol car because it just came back from the shop for servicing. I was aware of the initial call regarding POMARES because I receive dispatch notifications of radio calls via my car's computer. I knew that the original call was a welfare check of POMARES, who was suicidal and on-foot in the area of St. Francis High School. I knew other units were in the area checking for POMARES, but I didn't know where they were. I didn't know there were two separate calls. I thought everything was a continuation of the original call. I didn't know about there were two separate calls until afterward.

The original call reported that POMARES had tried to hang himself in the past, so I was concerned that he might try to do something like go up the railroad tracks nearby that area and try to kill himself. That was my thought process at that point. I don't know if she was dispatched to that call, but I know that Officer Duckham checked the area. I know from looking at the text of the call afterward that Officer Duckham was the only officer assigned to the original call. There was nothing in my mind that concerned me that the original call wasn't being handled by an officer. So far as I knew, the original call and everything up to the contact with POMARES was one continuous incident.

After going through the car wash, I went inside the building to use the restroom, and I was just walking back to my patrol car when I heard Officer Duckham say on the radio that she found POMARES. I think she said, "I got him," and I knew what incident she was talking about. I think it was less than a minute later I heard Officer Duckham say POMARES was holding a knife to his stomach, and she needed units to respond "code-3." I knew at that point that I needed to get there.

I got in my car and took off code-3 from the Kinney Facility to the scene. As I was leaving the facility, I saw Officer Bohrer there, and I found out later that she followed me to the scene. While I was on the freeway, still enroute, I heard a female officer get on the radio to request more taser cartridges. I got on the radio and stated that I had more but I was still a distance away. I don't know if that got out though. So as I was enroute, I knew that POMARES was armed with a knife, more taser cartridges were needed, and the bean bag shotgun was requested. I also heard an officer get on the radio and ask dispatch to contact the homeowner at the scene to inform them to lock their doors and stay inside. I thought that was good thinking on that officer's part.

I got off the freeway on the J Street off-ramp. When I was driving down J Street, I heard another officer request the bean bag shotgun on the radio. I arrived onscene, and notified dispatch via radio that I was there. I parked in







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the middle of the street near where the crime scene tape was put up. Officer Frazer came running out to me, and I ran to the back of my car to get the bean bag shotgun out of the trunk.

I had just transferred from the south station where we kept bean bag rounds in a holder attached to the stock of the bean bag shotguns. I hadn't checked my car's bean bag shotgun this morning when I left the station, so when I opened up the trunk and saw no bean bag shotgun shells, I went to my gear bag to look for some. I couldn't find any.

I heard commotion at the house where the incident was occurring. I believe I heard some taser rounds going off at that point. I put the bean bag shotgun on the floorboard of my car and locked the doors. I ran over to the scene, drawing my taser as I ran. I heard someone yelling to draw the taser. There was a civilian lady across the street yelling something.

I got to the scene and stood behind the car that POMARES was in front of. I got my first sight of POMARES as soon as I passed the front corner of the house. I could see POMARES was sitting on the ground with his back against a fence. I could see blood on him, and it looked like he was stabbing himself. POMARES had a very large knife with a six-inch blade. He was holding it to his stomach [demonstrating by simulating both hands on the handle with the tip against the abdomen] then he brought it up around his face. When I got up there, Officer Baker asked me where the bean bag shotgun was. I told her I couldn't find the shells, and she said she had some. I told Officer Frazer to go get the bean bag rounds and the bean bag shotgun.

I think all the officers were verbally communicating with POMARES because we all wanted him to stop doing what he was doing. I heard officers telling POMARES, "Put it down, drop it," and "Don't do it." Somebody said, "Oh no," when POMARES stabbed himself in the throat or eye. POMARES was agitated the whole time. He was looking at us and his body language suggested he was trying to indicate, "Come near me, and I'm going to kill myself." He didn't say that, but his facial expression was like, "I dare you."

POMARES then proceeded to take the knife to his throat and he pushed the blade all the way into his throat. His facial expression and body language at this time seemed like he was telling us, "Screw you." We were trying to tase him to get him to stop. POMARES had pointed the knife at us and waved it in an agitated manner. It didn't look like we could approach him in that scenario. I discharged my taser, but I couldn't see if the darts contacted POMARES or not. There were so many wires out because of previous taser deployments. At one point I reached up to remove the spent cartridge of my taser and it was still cycling because I got a little "zap." I don't really know what my cycle sequence was. I was confident that my taser was operating because of that. I don't know how many tasers were being discharged at that point, but I know that we were running out of cartridges, so I don't know how many were discharged before I got there.

During all this, Officer Frazer arrived with the bean bag shotgun, and he started firing bean bag rounds at POMARES because he was still trying to stab his own face. Officer Frazer was standing right beside me on my left side. I had moved up to the front of the car in the driveway. I guess at that point, that's when POMARES stabbed himself in the eye. I didn't see that specific thing. Officer Frazer fired one or two rounds initially, then POMARES fell over on his left side. At some point right then, I got on the radio and requested the fire department come to the scene and stage for medical aid. POMARES was kind of squirming around on the ground, so I told Officer Frazer to "shoot towards"

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his butt." I didn't want a round going into POMARES' head or in that area with him squirming. I saw Officer Frazer fire a round aiming at POMARES' butt, however, I couldn't tell where the rounds were actually hitting him. My opinion was that POMARES had damaged himself that his injuries had finally affected him, or the bean bag rounds took effect. It was amazing that POMARES held onto the knife as long as he did.

I thought it was necessary to use the bean bag rounds because I wanted POMARES to stop stabbing himself. It was a horrendous thing to watch someone do something like that to themselves. At that point I thought whatever we could do to get him to stop was appropriate before using lethal force. If he wanted to kill himself, he could do it, and the bean bag rounds were the only thing we could do at that point. There's no way I could jeopardize my officers by using a physical approach in that situation. I didn't see POMARES threaten the officers with the knife while I was there. I saw POMARES holding the knife to his abdomen, face and head area. POMARES' manner and facial expressions were very aggressive. He held the knife away from his body to show it to us with a facial expression meant to push us away. POMARES wasn't sitting still. He was moving a lot, but I don't know if he was trying to stand up.

There was no doubt in my mind that POMARES wasn't trying to do anything but hurt himself. I think his behavior was more to keep us away from him.

I was at the front of the car in the driveway, facing POMARES. Officer Frazer was beside me on my left. Officer Duckham, I don't know where she started out from, but she ended up right in front of me when POMARES dropped the knife. Other than that, I can't remember how the other officers were positioned.

At some point after the bean bag rounds were fired, POMARES disengaged from the knife, and officers were able to grab him and pull him out and kick the knife away. I couldn't see how it happened, because the convergence of officers in front of me blocked my view. About 25 seconds after the last bean bag round was fired, I saw that one of the officers grabbed POMARES and dragged him out of his position. The officers weren't directed to do it, they just did it when they saw POMARES dropped the knife. One of the officers kicked the knife under the fence.

I got some rubber gloves out and handed them to Officer Duckham. I requested the fire department respond "code-3" because officers started CPR on POMARES. At that point the bean bag shotgun was put back into my car, but I don't remember if I did it or if Officer Frazer did it. I started managing the scene by getting a couple more units there to protect the scene and to begin a witness canvass. The fire department transported POMARES to the hospital.

I didn't see him at the front door of my grandparent's house and that was before we got there. I didn't see him hurting himself back there and I was talking to Ofc. Pangelian who was telling me that the tasers were non lethal. The officers had to use their tasers about eight times but they didn't seem to work. Robert is schizophrenic.

I heard the officers told him to stop hurting himself or put down the knife. I heard that maybe once. I didn't see the officers use any other type of a weapon. I didn't hear Robert say or yell anything and I really couldn't see him when he was near the back fence.

I don't think that Robert was taking his medication like he is supposed to. I know Robert's mom, dad, step-mom, and brother. I don't know if Robert used drugs or alcohol. My mom's parents used to baby sit him when they were little.

I know that Robert suffered from addiction. He was pretty depressed. I haven't talked to him in over a year now. I know his brother also. I did not know that he (the had passed away recently.

Robert's addiction led him to appear to be Schizophrenic. Robert typically carried a gun and I thought it was unsafe to be around. The last time I saw him, I told him that I loved him and then I just didn't call him back. I got into sobriety myself and I didn't want to be around him. Drinking was a big part of my life, but it didn't do anything for me. I have been sober for about 1 year and 4 months.

I know Robert used Cocaine and other narcotics. I believe that stuff caused his Schizophrenia. The narcotics definitely caused his chemical imbalance in his head.

He carried a gun because he thought he needed protection of some sort. One time (approx 6-7 years ago) he came to my house and just set a gun on the table while we were talking and I told him he had to go. He was talking that the FBI was after him and that they were hacking into his computer. This was all around 6 years ago though.

I am unaware of any other incidents where he was in contact with the Police. After the gun incident, I decided to keep my distance from him. Last time I saw him was in a grocery store parking lot on Alhambra in passing. We stopped and talked for a little bit and I gave him a hug. We said- Let's keep in touch- but we never did.

I do not know where Robert was living or how he got around.

Robert moved in with my Uncle **Constitution** in Chico and became a Fireman (CDF) from about 1996 to 2000. My uncle worked as a Fire Battalion Chief up in Chico and got Robert on the Fire Department up there. My Uncle's phone number is **Constitution** and he has an address of **Constitution**. Robert had gotten involved with a girl. That didn't end up working out and it caused him to get rather angry with life. I think that is the main reason he quit his job at the Fire Department. He came back to Sacramento to pursue a relationship with the girl. I think that is the point where his life started going downhill. That is when he got addicted to narcotics.



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I know he had some family issues with his dad and his stepmother. That is why he came to live with us at such a young age.

He showed up at my work one time and showed my 15 pages of paper saying "look, here is proof they are trying to take my inheritance." The paper was just Stars and crazy stuff on it. There were no words on the paper at all. He must have been high.

On 01/19/13, at approximately 1100 hours, I received a call from the Comm. Center regarding a possible death in custody/suicidal subject call-out. I was informed a suicidal subject armed himself with a knife, attempted to gain entry to a home and gave himself several lacerations and puncture wounds with a knife. The subject had been tased and shot with multiple bean-bag rounds before officers were able to get the knife from him and transported him to UCD Medical Center where he was declared deceased. I was requested to respond to 43rd St. to begin the death investigation. I contacted Dets. Curtin, Johnson, Maclafferty, Quinn, Saario, Shrum and Trimpey by cell phone text message and requested they also respond. I contacted Det. Sgt. Monk by phone and requested he also respond to assist.

I arrived at the scene at approximately 1215 hours and checked in with scene recorder, Ofc. McGovern. While waiting for the briefing to begin, I was given information from Sgt. McKenna that the deceased was identified as Robert Greg Pomares. His mother, **Sector**, had been one of the original callers and she was at her home at **Sector**. Sacramento and was standing by with a chaplain. I had Det. Shrum respond to the hospital to confirm Pomares's injuries and then respond to **Sector** home to obtain a statement from her.

At approximately 1243 hours, Sgt. McKenna conducted the briefing and gave a summary of the circumstances to that point. Present for the briefing was Capt. Peletta, Acting Capt. Champion, Lts. Eklund and Leong, Sgts. Monk, Husted and Rogers, Ofcs. Sood, Smith and CSI Joseph as well as the remaining detectives who were requested to respond to the scene. Sgt. McKenna stated Ofc. Duckham fired her CED, then Ofc. Callaghan gave her his CED to discharge. Ofcs. Baker, Butler, Warren, Zeek, Bohrer and Sgt. Bell all arrived and discharged their CEDs. Ofc. Frazier got the less-lethal shotgun from Sgt. Bell's vehicle and Ofc. Baker obtained four bean bag rounds from her vehicle. Ofc. Frazier then discharged the bean bag rounds at Pomares. During the whole incident, Pomares continued to cause injury to himself until he appeared to lose consciousness. At that time the knife was moved away from him and CPR was administered while fire personnel responded. Engine 8 and Medic 6 arrived and transported Pomares to UCDMC where he was declared deceased at 1033 hours.

At approximately 1315 hours, walk-throughs of the scene were conducted with each officer, his counsel and the interviewing detective. Also present was Det. Curtin and Ofc. Sood from IA. Det. Curtin was instructed to process the scene and he and I conducted a thorough walk-through of the scene, including entering the back yard of the location of occurrence, 43rd St. The less-lethal shotgun was removed from Sgt. Bell's vehicle and booked as evidence. Four of the CEDs had been collected and placed into Ofc. Butler's vehicle. I collected and took custody of them to be downloaded before being returned to the respective officers.





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I then cleared the scene and responded to HOJ to begin monitoring officer interviews. Information had been obtained from witnesses that Pomares had prior history in Butte County, Oroville and Chico. I contacted Butte County Sheriff and inquired if there had been prior incidents in their jurisdiction with Pomares. I spoke to a dispatcher who ran Pamares in their system and stated they hadn't had any contact with anyone by his name. Information was also obtained that Pomares had spent the prior evening at a cousin's house and I directed Dets. Quinn and Saario to locate the cousin and obtain a statement from her.

I had Capt. Peletta download each of the tasers used in the incident and later booked the taser download report and made a copy for the use of force report to be completed by Sgt. McKenna. I later returned each taser to each officer at the end of their interview or to their sergeant's desk at their station after they had returned home.

On 01/21/13, at approximately 1330 hours, I spoke with Medical Examiner Rieber by phone. He advised that he had conducted the autopsy of Pomares earlier in the day and determined that the cause of death was not confirmed but likely was that Pomares had suffocated on his own blood due to the major injuries he had caused to his throat and neck. He stated that there were 8 taser barbs noted on Pomares, coupled in pairs and separate. He also had 3 apparent bean-bag strikes: right lower chest, back of right thigh and left calf. None of the injuries appeared to contribute to his cause of death per Rieber.

I, Detective Scott MacLafferty #0749, am currently assigned as a Homicide Detective with the Sacramento Police Department. On Saturday, January 19th, at approx. 1107 hours, Sgt. Stigerts asked me to respond to 43rd Street to assist on a death in custody investigation of a suicidal subject who had stabbed himself and had also been tased and bean bagged multiple times. I arrived at approx. 1205 hours, and found the scene to be secured with uniformed officers and crime scene tape. I checked in with the scene recorder (Ofc. McGovern) and entered the scene.

On 01/19/13 at approx. 1243 hours, I attended a briefing held by Sgt. Mike McKenna of the facts of the case as he knew them. Det. Trimpey, Johnson, Det. Quinn, Sgt. Stigerts, Sgt. Monk, Lt. Eklund, Capt. Peletta were also present from the SPD investigations unit. There were other CSI, SPD Internal Affairs, and patrol representatives present.

Sgt. McKenna said that SPD patrol officers responded to the area of 53rd Street and Folsom Blvd to check for Robert Pomares who was suicidal per his mother. Officers were unable to locate him and cleared the call. At approx. 0910 hours, his mother called again and gave a possible location for him in the area of 43rd Street. Officer Duckham arrived at approx. 0946 hours, and located Pomares walking southbound on 43rd Street. He ran to 43rd Street where she contacted him pounding on the door trying to get in. Pomares began cutting himself and Ofc. Duckham fired her CED. Ofc. Duckham received Ofc. Callahan's CED and fired it also. Additional officers arrived and fired there CED's in attempt to subdue Pomares suicidal actions. These officers included Ofc. Baker, Butler, Warren, Zeek, Bohrer, and Sgt. Bell. Ofc. Frazer arrived and ultimately fired four bean bag rounds at Pomares as well as his CED. Pomares eventually was disarmed and officers began life saving measures until the fire department arrived and transported him to UCDMC. Pomares was declared as deceased at UCDMC.

I was assigned to interview Ofc. Duckham, Ofc. Callahan, and Ofc. Frazer.

On 01/19/13 at approx. 1315 hours, I completed a walk thru of the crime scene with Ofc.Duckham. Sean Howell (Attorney), Sgt. Stigerts, Det. Curtin, and Ofc. Sood (SPD Internal Affairs) attended the walk thru. Ofc. Duckham pointed out where she was when she first contacted Pomares on 43rd Street and where she was in front of a hedge in the front yard of 43rd Street when the confrontation began.

On 01/19/13 at approx. 1319 hours, I completed a walk thru of the crime scene with Ofc. Callahan. Sean Howell (Attorney), Sgt. Stigerts, Det Curtin, and Ofc. Sood were present for this. Ofc. Callahan showed us the general area where the confrontation took place in the yard of 43rd Street.



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On 01/1913 at approx. 1321 hours, I completed a walk thru of the crime scene with Ofc. Frazer. Sean Howell (Attorney), Sgt. Stigerts, Det. Curtin, and Ofc. Sood were present. Ofc. Frazer showed us the general area in the car port/driveway of 43rd Street where he fired the bean bag rounds and his CED at Pomares.

I then returned to the Hall of Justice to conduct the official interviews.

On 01/19/13 at approx. 1543 hours, I took a recorded statement from Ofc. Duckham (see transcribed statement).

On 01/19/13 at approx. 1652 hours, I took a recorded statement from Ofc. Callahan (see transcribed statement).

On 01/19/13 at approx. 1740 hours, I took a recorded statement from Ofc. Frazer (see transcribed statement).

On 01/22/13, I called Butte County Sheriff's Department and Chico PD who found no record or incidents with Robert Pomares.

On 01/24/13, I spoke with **Constant** to arrange a time to speak with her daughter **Constant** who witnessed the incident. **Constant** told me that she was at Socal's Tavern on this date and spoke with the bar tender **Constant**) and they got to talking about the incident. **Constant** said that **Constant** told her that he thought it was Mr Pomares that came into Socals on the morning of 01/20/13 and took a knife that he was using to cut some fruit as his knife came up missing and \$10 was left after Pomares left the bar.

On 01/24/13 at approx. 1630 hours, I took a recorded statement from **Control**. (See summary statement).

On 01/25/13 at approx. 0730 hours, I took a recorded statement from **1**. (See summary statement).

On 01/28/13, I received the DAR logs that included 911 calls and radio traffic. I booked a copy into evidence. In the radio traffic Ofc. Callahan requested that the residents of 43rd Street lock their door and not answer. He also requested that fire units stage close. Several units request additional code 3 units to respond with additional tazers. Sgt. Bell requested another Sgt. with additional bean bags and then the Fire Department code-3.

At 0828 hours, SPD Communications received a 911 transfer from CHP from who was reporting that her son Robert was suicidal. She said that she told Robert that she was going to call the police to take him to the hospital. He was supposed to be in the area of 53rd and Folsom Blvd inside a fast food restaurant. He had just called **sectors** for a ride and his cell phone number was **sectors**. **Sector** said that his brother died three weeks ago and he could not take it and was going to kill himself by unknown means.

At 0909 hours, another 911 call was received from who was calling about her son Robert Pomares. She was reporting that he was retarded, suicidal and in front of St. Francis High School. said that Pomares was down from Chico for his brother's funeral. She said that he has attempted suicide in the past by attempting to hang himself. said that Pomares told said that Pomares (b) and another friend named that he was going to kill himself.

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At 0920 hours, SPD Communications called Robert (1990) and spoke with him. Robert said that he was at his cousins house and then there was an open line with no speaking. The call taker attempted to call back and left a message.

I reviewed the phone download of Mr. Pomares cell phone **Constant (1997)**) as completed by Det. McDougle and noted the following applicable calls. (Refer to Det. McDougle's Report).

I burned copies of ICC video footage that included the time frame 0910-1010 hours on 01/19/13. These ICC copies were for Ofc. Butler, Ofc. Frazer, Ofc. Baker, Sgt. Bell, and Ofc. Bohrer. All copies were booked into evidence.

On 07/26/13, I contacted the Sacramento Coroners Office who advised the case was ruled a suicide by sharp force injury to the neck. The toxicology was not complete yet.

I, Det. Thomas Shrum #362, am currently assigned to the Homicide Unit of the Sacramento Police Department.

On 1/19/13, at 1118 hours, I responded to a text request from Det. Sgt. Stiggerts to respond to a death in custody investigation. I contacted dispatch and learned that the location was 43rd Street and responded from my home.

I arrived at the scene at approximately 1158 hours. When I arrived, 43rd Street a few houses south of J Street was barricaded with crime scene tape and police vehicles. There were numerous officers, vehicles, and police supervisors on scene.

I checked in with Officer McGovern who was assigned to be crime scene recorder.

Det. Sgt. Stiggerts and Det. Sgt. Monk responded to supervise the homicide call out team that included Det. Curtin, Det. MacLafferty, Det. Saario, Det. Trimpey, and I.

Prior to the patrol briefing, Det. Sgt. Stiggerts told me that the deceased was Robert Greg Pomares 12/2/1973 and that he was at UC Davis Hospital. She asked that I go to the hospital and make contact with the Coroner's Office and then contact his mother,

I left the scene and arrived at UC Davis Hospital at 1224 hours. When I arrived at the Hospital, CSI Peirsol was leaving and he advised me that the body had been covered with a sheet when he arrived and he was unable to get photographs.

I went into the hospital and Officer Pangelinan #918 was standing by with the deceased in area E-6 of the hospital. Officer Pangelinan advised me that he was at the hospital when the deceased was being treated and Dr. pronounced him deceased at 1033 hours. Pangelinan told me that he was given the clothing of the deceased which included his wallet and also that Pangelinan had collected CED probes and leads (wiring) that the hospital staff had pulled from Robert Pomares and thrown into a medical waste bin. Pangelinan had recovered the probes and leads and put them into a bag separate from the clothing. Pangelinan found an ID for the deceased inside the wallet and identification for Robert Greg Pomares 12/2/1973,

, 5'9", 185 pounds.

Pangelinan told me that the deceased had a cut on his left torso that had been done at the hospital in their attempt to massage his heart.

The body of Robert Pomares was on a gurney and the body was covered with a sheet.



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At 1253 hours, I called the Sacramento County Coroner's Office. I spoke to M. Her, Investigator #21, and she explained that they would be delayed in getting to the hospital and she requested that hospital staff obtain a rectal temperature for the deceased.

I spoke to a nurse in the ER and explained the Coroner's request for a rectal temperature. Per the nurse, once the person is pronounced, they no longer will continue treatment and the Coroner's Office would have to obtain the temperature. I called back to the Coroner's Office and investigator Carver told me that he was on his way.

I contacted CSI Officer Peirsol and had him return to the hospital for photos.

Investigator Carver arrived in the ER at approximately 1335 hours. He provided the Coroner's case number, 13-00413. He removed the sheet covering the body.

I observed the body of Robert Pomares. His body, and especially the head, neck and upper body were covered with blood. He was unclothed. The gurney cloth was covered with blood and blood had fallen onto the floor and was pooling under the gurney. Pomares had a large horizontal laceration across his left chest. He had a jagged cut to his left inner upper arm. The left chest was covered with medical tape. Pomares had several medical pads attached to his upper body. There were several small round dark spots I noticed on his abdomen that I believed could be CED burns. He had a large jagged wound to his throat which had a tracheotomy tube inserted inside of it. There was an IV line lead into the left tibia. There was a central arterial line in the right inner thigh. There was an oval bruise on the right outer thigh towards the rear.

Officer Peirsol took photos of Robert Pomares at the hospital.

I spoke to Carver regarding blood samples that had been drawn and he advised me that he would be requesting toxicology on any blood that had been drawn and he would be speaking to staff in order to secure any sample as soon as possible.

At 1355 hours, Investigator Carver obtained a rectal thermometer reading of 36.0 degrees celsius. At Carver's request, Nurse **1111**, Officer Pangelinan, and I assisted in turning the body so that he could insert the thermometer and obtain the reading. The body was already stiff with rigor mortis. 36.0 degrees Celsius is within normal range and not indicative of excited delirium.

At 1402 hours, I went with Investigator Carver and spoke to Dr. who had pronounced the victim deceased. who had pronounced that the injuries to the neck were there prior to medical intervention and he could see that the throat had several cuts to it. He saw that the trachea had been injured and was open to the air and he was able to insert the tracheotomy tube within the existing cuts. The cut to the left chest was medical intervention but the cut to the left arm was not. Dr. was assisted with treatment of Pomeres.

Investigator Carver advised me that he would not be needing the property of Robert Pomares. I advised CSI Peirsol to take the property that Officer Pangelinan had obtained and to book it into evidence.



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At 1419 hours, I returned to the scene at 43rd Street. I spoke to Det. Curtain regarding briefing information and learned that Pomares was believed to have live in the house at some point but no longer did.

A summary of statement:

explained that Robert had had mental issues since being a sophomore and having a traumatic head injury where a metal plate was put into his skull. He had been suicidal many times and had made other attempts. She had recently lost her older son **sector** on Christmas Day, 2012 and Robert had come back to Sacramento from Chico where he lived because of his brother's death. **Sector** explained that Robert took Seroquel, a potent anti-depressant and that he had not been taking it. He had an episode 4 days earlier at her house which included hallucinations regarding people coming through the walls after him. He had kept her awake that night and ran into the street at 3 in the morning with a stick that he thought was a knife. After that night, his cousin **sector** had called Robert and had Robert come stay with her where he had another episode during the night. This morning, **so** spoke to Robert on the phone and he wanted to come home. She told him she would get some money for a cab to get him but that he had a problem and had to get some help. He yelled no and that was the last she spoke to him. She was later called by **so**, a girlfriend/ lover for her son **so** whose parents lived on 42nd Street and who told her what had happened to Robert.

NOTIFICATION:

On Saturday, 1-19-13, at 1107 hours, I, T.Curtin #0543 (IV49), received a text from Homicide Sgt Stigerts to respond to a death in custody investigation at 43rd St, in Sacramento.

ARRIVAL:

At 1134 hours, I arrived on scene and checked in with the Crime Scene Recorder- Officer McGovern #892.

BRIEFING:

At 1243 hours, once the call-out team was present, Sgt McKenna #3034 (2SM33) briefed us about the incident and the circumstances known to him at the time. Detectives L.Trimpey #806 (IV 106), S. MacLafferty #749 (IV53), M. Johnson #706 (IV173), Sgt Stigerts #3096 (IV10), Sgt Monk #3033 (IV24), Captain Peletta #5100, Acting Captain Champion #4060, Lt Eklund #4014, Lt Leong #3034 (LN24), Sgt Husted #3068 (STF 20), Sgt Rogers #3006 (LN16), Officer Sood (#721), Officer D. Smith #338 (SPOA 1) and CSI Joseph #0361 (CSI13) and I attended the briefing. See Detective MacLafferty's observations for details of the briefing.

Evidence was located on scene by patrol officers and subsequently pointed out to investigators. All evidence was left in place and the investigation was that time.

LEGAL ACCESS TO SCENE:

The incident occurred on the front porch and driveway of 43rd St. The residents of 43rd St. St, and were present and gave consent for the police department to access their residence, as well as, front and back yards.

WALK-THROUGH:

At 1315 hours, a walk-through of the scene were conducted were conducted with each officer, his/ her counsel and the interviewing detective. Items of evidence were pointed out by the officers during the walk-through. After the walk through with the officers, the resident **former and the interviewing** provided me with a key to the driveway gate, which provided access to the backyard. Sgt Stigerts and I then conducted a complete walk through of the scene.

SCENE LIGHTING:

The scene was processed under daylight conditions.

EVIDENCE OF SURVEILLANCE VIDEO:

At the briefing, Sergeant McKenna advised that canvassing patrol officers had not located any exterior surveillance cameras at any of the neighboring residences. Several of the responding officers had their In Car Camera (ICC) systems activated during the incident. The ICC system was downloaded and reviewed by the interviewing detectives at the Hall of Justice.

VICTIM INFORMATION:

Victim Pomares was transported from the scene to the UC Davis Medical Center prior to detectives' arrival. Victim Pomares was pronounced deceased at 1033 hours at UC Davis Medical Center by Doctor

IDENTIFICATION OF THE VICTIM:

The victim was verbally identified via witness statements as Robert Pomares. Patrol Officers were able to locate a Sacramento County WebKPF photograph () of the victim and confirmed his identity.

SCENE DESCRIPTION:

The incident occurred on the front porch and driveway area of 43rd St, located within the City and County of Sacramento. 43rd St is a single family, two story residence located on the west side of 43rd St. The front door of the residence faces east towards 43rd St, there is a raised cement front of the front door which runs south to the driveway. The driveway runs porch in on the south side of the residence and consists of two driving strips. The drive way runs from 43rd St to a wooden gate that connects to the S/W corner of the residence. The driveway continues behind the wooden gate to a detached garage which is set on the west edge of the property lot. The living room is at the south/east corner of the house and has two large leaded glass windows facing east towards 43rd St. There are four leaded windows (sets of two) on the south wall of living room that face the driveway. The two sets of leaded windows are separated by a fireplace and chimney. The far west window had several panes broken out and the leaded in lays bent in towards the interior of the residence.

The wooden gate located at the west end of the drive, was shut and locked during the incident. Two CED darts, items #2 and #3, were located stuck in the wooden gate. The wooden gate



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has a space of approx six inches between the bottom of the gate and the ground. During the walk through, the gate was unlocked and opened. Item #1, a large butcher knife with white handle and apparent blood on it, was located behind the gate, to the west, in the backyard.

All of the items of evidence were observed, placard, photographed and video-taped.

VEHICLE(S):

The residents' silver 2000 Honda Accord, , was parked in the driveway, facing West. The front of the Honda was even with the S/E corner of the residence. The passenger's side door of the Accord was parked adjacent to the South edge of the raised front porch. Item #32, blood sample, was collected from a small circle (approx 3" in diameter) of blood found on the top center

area, of the Accord.

Officer Duckham's black and white patrol vehicle (#11439) was left in place, just North of 43rd St, facing S/B. There were numerous other marked patrol cars that responded to the scene and were moved to allow fire and medics access to the victim. CSI photographed the locations of the marked patrol units when detectives arrived on scene.

CORONERS OFFICE:

Coroner Investigator Kip Carver #32 responded to the UC Davis Medical Center to take custody of the victim Robert Pomares. Investigator Caver later responded to 43rd St and took photos of the scene. For additional information regarding the manner and cause of death, see Coroner's report (Case # 1300413).

CSI PERSONNEL:

The following CSI personnel assisted in the location, identification, diagramming, photographing, and collection of evidence located at the crime scene:

Forensic Investigator Schiele #6369(FI-20), CSI Peirsol #431 (CSI-21) and CSI Joseph #361 (CSI-13).

MEASUREMENTS AND DIAGRAM:

CSI Peirsol #431 took measurements of the overall scene, including all itmes of evidence and completed the crime scene diagrams.

PHOTOGRAPHS:

CSI Joseph #361 took all photographs of the crime scene including all items of evidence.

VIDEOTAPE:

I videotaped the crime scene including the various items of evidence that were collected by CSI. I later booked the video data card into evidence at Police Headquarters (see PR# 768973-1).



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PHYSICAL EVIDENCE:

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Numerous items of evidence were documented and collected from the crime scene located at 43rd St. For exact location and descriptions of evidence collected from the scene, please refer to the CSI reports, diagrams, and photographs. CSI collected all evidence at my direction and later booked it into the SPD Evidence and Property Section. All of the evidence items were assigned numbered placards and photographed, in place, with the numbered placards.

The following evidence items were collected and booked under Property Report # 768751 by CSI Joseph #361.

Note- I, Detective Curtin collected, Items # 33 (CED) and #36 (LG Cell Phone) at the scene. I transported the CED to the Hall Of Justice and gave it to Sgt Stigerts for a data down load. The CED was later released back to Officer Duckham. I transported the phone to the Electronic Crime Unit for analysis.-

I am a detective assigned to the Homicide Unit with the primary responsibility of investigating homicides, suspicious deaths, in-custody deaths, and officer-involved incidents.

On Saturday, January 19th, at approx. 1110 hours, Homicide Sgt. M. Stigerts notified me by telephone respond to 43rd Street to assist on a death-in-custody investigation regarding a suicidal subject who had stabbed himself to death. Patrol officers used tasers and bean bag rounds multiple times in an attempt to prevent the subject from killing himself. I arrived at approx. 1155hours, and found the scene to be secured with uniformed officers and crime scene tape. I checked in with the scene recorder (Ofc. McGovern) and entered the scene.

At approximately 1243 hours, I attended a briefing held by Sgt. Mike McKenna of the facts of the case as he knew them (See Detective MacLafferty's supplement for details.)

Sgt. Stigerts assigned me to interview Patrol Sergeant Sherry Bell, Officers Dee Baker and Cynthea Bohrer. Prior to each interview, I escorted each individually on a scene "walk-through" for the purpose of understanding each officer's positioning and vantage points at the scene as the incident unfolded. SPOA attorney Judith Odbert, accompanied the officers during the walk-throughs. I audio recorded the walk throughs with a digital recorder, and later transferred the recording to CD and booked it as evidence.

I then went to the homicide office and to meet with the officers for interviews.

On 1-19-13 at 1537 hours, I interviewed Officer Baker in interview room #6, which was audio/video recorded onto DVD and later booked as evidence. During the interview, Officer Baker drew an impromptu sketch of the scene, which I also booked as evidence. I also had Ofc. Baker's CED data downloaded by Capt. Peletta prior to the conclusion of the interview.

On 1-19-13 at 1641 hours, I interviewed Officer Bohrer in interview room #6, which was audio/video recorded onto DVD and later booked as evidence. During the interview, I showed her two Google "Street View" images of the scene for reference. I later booked these images at evidence.

On 1-19-13 at 1725 hours, I interviewed Sergeant Bell in interview room #6, which was audio/video recorded onto DVD and later booked as evidence.

At the conclusion of the interviews, Sgt. Stigerts relieved me of further duties.

I checked in with the crime scene recorder, Officer McGovern, and proceeded to the briefing location.

At approximately 1243 hours, I attended a briefing conducted by Sgt. McKenna of all information known to him at the time of the briefing. Sgt. McKenna identified the deceased as Robert Pomares (12-2-73) and stated he was in a confrontation with officers in front of 43rd St when he used his own knife to inflict stab wounds to his torso and neck causing him to die. Sgt. McKenna advised officers deployed CED's in an attempt to gain compliance from Pomares and have him drop his knife. (For complete briefing details see Det. MacLafferty's supplement) At the time of the briefing I was accompanied by Det. Shrum, Det. MacLafferty, Det. Curtin, Det. Johnson and Sgt. Stigerts. The briefing also included Lt. Eklund, SPOA President D. Smith and members of SPD Internal Affairs.

At the conclusion of the briefing Sgt. Stigerts advised I would be responsible for interviewing Officer Tyson Butler, Officer Ethan Zeek and Officer Jason Warren.

At approximately 1334 hours, I conducted a public safety walk through with Officer Jason Warren. Officer Warren was accompanied by his attorney, Gabriel Quinnan, and Sgt. Stigerts and Det. Curtin also observed the public safety walk through. Officer Warren stated that he was standing on the driver's side of the car in the driveway when he deployed his CED. Officer Zeek advised he deployed his CED in a western direction towards the subject who was near the fence of 43rd St.

At approximately 1336 hours, I conducted a public safety walk through with Officer Ethan Zeek. Officer Zeek was accompanied by his attorney, Gabriel Quinnan, and Sgt. Stigerts and Det. Curtin also observed the public safety walk through. Officer Zeek stated that he was standing at a 45 degree angle from the suspect in the driveway of 43rd St. Officer Zeek advised that he deployed his CED in a northwest direction and deployed one cartridge with three to four cycles.

At approximately 1337 hours, I conducted a public safety walk through with Officer Tyson Butler. Officer Butler was accompanied by his attorney, Gabriel Quinnan, and Sgt. Stigerts and Det. Curtin also observed the public safety walk through. Officer Butler stated that he was standing near the corner of the chimney and deployed one CED cartridge, four cycles, in a western direction towards the suspect.



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

In addition Ofc Frazer had been authorized to deploy the bean bag shotgun in an attempt to stop the subject.

I was advised that four CEDs were secured in the trunk of Butler's vehicle and that four other officers still had their recently used CEDs on them.



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They were advised to keep things where they were. There were eight CEDs used by the seven officers. Apparently Ofc Duckham was the first to deploy and when the subject still continue to resist Ofc Callaghan passed her his. He had lethal coverage at the time. Ofc Duckham then used his to no avail.

A neighborhood canvass was conducted by assisting officers including Cannon, McGovern, L Matthew, K Wilhite and F Reyes while Ofc Pangelinan was at UCDMC with the deceased subject.

Each of the officers advised me what they had learned from their initial canvass.

I then conducted a detective briefing at 1243 hrs for Sgt Stigerts' team, Lt Eklund, Lt Leong and Captain Pelatta.

At the conclusion of the briefing detectives did their walk through and I turned control of the scene over to Sgt Stigerts.

Ofc McGovern and K Wilhite were left behind and eventually relieved by swing shift for scene security while CSI completed their work.

I transported **to 300** Richards for follow up interviews with detectives.


