# CLEARING REPORTS BY ARREST/EXCEPTIONAL MEANS

09-16-91

## PURPOSE

To establish procedures for clearing crime reports.

## POLICY

To comply with the standards set forth by the Uniform Crime Report of the FBI when clearing Crime Reports.

#### PROCEDURE:

Personnel of this office shall use the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) standards and guidelines when clearing a case by either "arrest" or "exceptional means". No distinction between cleared by "arrest" and "exceptional means" is made on the report.

A. <u>CLEARANCE BY ARREST:</u>

An offense is "cleared by arrest" or solved for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is:

- 1. arrested
- 2. charged with the commission of the offense
- 3. turned over to the court for prosecution
- 4. A clearance by arrest can be claimed when the offender is a person under 18 years of age and is cited to appear in juvenile court.

#### B. <u>EXCEPTIONAL CLEARANCES</u>

If the following questions can all be answered "yes" the offense can be cleared "exceptionally".

- 1. Has the investigation definitely established the identity of the offender?
- 2. Is there enough information to support an arrest charge, and turning over to the court for prosecution?
- 3. Is the exact location of the offender known so that the subject could be taken into custody?
- 4. Is there some reason outside law enforcement control that precludes arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender?
- C. Each case shall be reviewed on a case by case basis and depending upon the opinions of the detectives working the series and the supervisors directly involved in managing the series a decision is derived on whether or not to clear that series based on the arrest of the individual.
