



Design Phase Public Engagement Summary

Project Develop Team Meetings:

Throughout the project, the team of consultants met with the City's Project Development Team which was made up of representatives from different departments including traffic and public works. The team of consultants reviewed all key products with the City's Project Development Team.

Back to the Blvd pop-up Summary: September 15, 2019

The Franklin Blvd Business District coordinated a "Back to the Blvd" event to celebrate Mexican Independence Day. The event was planned as a classic car parade and show, and approximately 8 blocks on Franklin Blvd would be closed to traffic. As part of the event, the Franklin Blvd Complete Streets project was asked to create a pop-up outreach tent with tactile planning component – a full-scale mock-up of the planned improvements for Franklin Blvd. Thus, the pop-up outreach event included a canopy tent on the street, posters with visualizations and maps of planned improvements, and temporary striping treatments to demonstrate the envisioned travel lanes, bike lanes, and green areas.

Business Luncheon: March 30, 2018

The Franklin Boulevard Business Association hosted a business luncheon. The Project Team attended and presented at the event and set up an information booth in which attendees could learn more about the project.

Business/Commercial Meetings: February 27, 2018

The Project Team organized two English and Spanish meetings to follow-up with businesses on Franklin Boulevard. The team provided an overview of the project and reviewed the schedule and funding. The Team reviewed all the outreach activities to date and the community preferences. The Team allowed time for a presentation from the traffic engineering consultants.

Posada Community Outreach: December 15, 2017

The Project Team, in collaboration with the Historic Monterey Trail District attended a La Familia Counseling Center sponsored "posada" as a holiday event for families. The event was a community gathering with gifts, food, photos and resource tabling. The Team set up a table and shared information about the project with interested community members. This event was primarily attended by the local Latino community and thus the majority of the engagement was conducted in Spanish.



Street Design Workshop (Public Workshop #3): October 10, 2017

The City of Sacramento hosted a community workshop on October 10, 2017 from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Maple Neighborhood Center. The project team presented an update on the community engagement process and input obtained along with the proposed street design concepts. The workshop invited community members to provide feedback on the proposed street design alternatives and on the proposed streetscape enhancements. Pop-Up Event: October 8, 2017

The event was held in the St. Rose Catholic Church's parking lot from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The event provided a full-size mockup of the street design concept which community members were encouraged to interact with on foot and by bicycle.
